

**TREATY BETWEEN THE REPUBLIC OF INDONESIA AND
THE REPUBLIC OF SINGAPORE RELATING TO
THE DELIMINATION OF TERRITORIAL SEAS OF
THE TWO COUNTRIES IN THE WESTERN PART OF
THE STRAIT OF SINGAPORE**

THE REPUBLIC OF INDONESIA AND
THE REPUBLIC OF SINGAPORE,

May 25, 1973 (hereinafter referred to as "Treaty
1973"),

REMEMBERING that the coasts of the two countries
face each other in the Strait of Singapore,

CONSIDERING further that the territorial sea bound-
ary lines in the western part of the Strait of Singapore
will extend boundary lines in the Treaty 1973,

HAVING settled part of territorial sea boundary lines
in the Strait of Singapore in the Treaty between the
Republic of Indonesia and the Republic of Singapore
relating to the Delimitation of Territorial Seas of the
Two Countries in the Strait of Singapore signed on

INTENDING to better strengthen friendship between
the two countries,

HENCE, intend to determine the territorial sea bound

ary lines of the two Countries in the western part of the Strait of Singapore,

HAVING APPROVED AS FOLLOWS :

ARTICLE 1

1. The territorial sea boundary lines of the Republic of Indonesia and the Republic of Singapore in the Strait of Singapore in the western area from Point 1 of the boundary lines agreed in the Treaty 1973 located on 1° 10' 46.0" Northern Latitude and 103° 40' 14.6" Eastern Longitude are a line consisting of straight lines drawn among points whose coordinates are as follows:

Points	Northern Latitude	Eastern Longitude
1	1° 10' 46.0"	103° 40' 14.6"
1A	1° 11' 17.4"	103° 39' 38.5"
1B	1° 11' 55.5"	103° 34' 20.4"
1C	1° 11' 43.8"	103° 34' 00.0"

2. Coordinates of points 1A, 1B and 1C determined in paragraph 1 are geographic coordinates based on the World Geodetic System 1984 and boundary lines connecting point 1 to point 1C shown in Attachment "A" to this Treaty.
3. The actual location of the above-mentioned points at sea will be determined through a method to be approved jointly by the authorized officials of the

two countries.

4. "The authorized officials" referred to in paragraph 3 for the Republic of Indonesia are the National Survey and Mapping Coordinating Board and the Indonesian Hydro-Oceanography Service and for the Republic of Singapore are any entities appointed by the Government of the Republic of Singapore.

ARTICLE 2

The boundary lines of the Treaty 1973 and the boundary lines drawn in Article 1 paragraph 1 as shown in Attachment "B" to this Treaty, are only for the purpose of illustration.

ARTICLE 3

Any arising dispute between the two countries relating to the interpretation or implementation of this Treaty will be settled peacefully through discussions or negotiations.

ARTICLE 4

This Treaty will be endorsed according to constitutional provisions of the two countries.

ARTICLE 5

This Treaty will begin to take effect as from the exchange date of ratified Charter.
