

Administrative Decree No. 96 of 30 October 1996

The Chairman of the Brazilian Institute for the Environment and Renewable Natural Resources (IBAMA), by virtue of the authority provided for in article 24 of the Regulatory Structure attached to Decree No. 78 1 of 5 April 1991, and in article 83, section XIV of the Internal Regulation approved by GM/MINTER Administrative Decree No. 445 of 16 August 1989, and taking into consideration the provisions contained in article 17, item II of Law No. 6.938 2 of 31 August 1981, with the draft contained in Law No. 7.804 3 of 18 July 1989, and

In consideration of the need to establish criteria for operation of the Federal Technical Registry of Potentially Polluting Activities or Those Which Use Environmental Resources, resolves as follows:

Art. 1. The Federal Technical Registry of Potentially Polluting Activities or Those Which Use Environmental Resources is intended to be used for the registration and control of all potentially polluting activities and/or the extraction, production, transportation and sale of products of potential danger to the environment, such as minerals, products and byproducts of fauna and flora, licensed by either State Environmental Agencies or by IBAMA itself, as well as those not yet licensed.

Art. 2. Requests for registration discussed in article 1, to be made by all individuals or legal entities engaged in those activities, shall be initiated by means of the submission of the following documents:

- Applications directed to IBAMA;
- A Federal Technical Registry of Potentially Polluting Activities or Those Which Use Environmental Resources form, duly completed;
- IBAMA Payment Document, duly notarized by the authorized banking network.

Art. 3. Registration shall take place upon analysis and approval of the submitted application, with the respective issuance of the Certificate of Registration, by the Control and Monitoring Office (DIRCOF/IBAMA).

Art. 4. Registration shall be valid for one year, and must be renewed by 28 February of each year, by means of payment by the interested party of the amount corresponding to its category, independent of prior notification from

IBAMA.

Sole paragraph. Payment must be made at any branch of the authorized banking network, by means of completion of the Payment Document, in accordance with the IBAMA price table.

Art. 5. After terminating the activity in question, the interested party must request cancellation of the respective registration, and shall be required to pay any debts to IBAMA as may exist.

Sole paragraph. In the event of a failure to request cancellation of the registration pursuant to this article, it shall be assumed that the interested party is still engaging in the corresponding activity, and must comply with the provisions contained in article 4, sole paragraph, of this Administrative Decree.

Art. 6. Violations of this Administrative Decree shall result in application of the penalties provided for under current law, in particular those contained in article 14 of Law No. 6.938 of 31 August 1981.

Art. 7. This Administrative Decree shall enter into effect on the date of its publication, revoking any provisions to the contrary.
