AN ACT to amend the Customs Act No. 9 of 2015.

[21st June, 2024].

BE IT ENACTED by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and the House of Representatives of Grenada, and by the authority of the same as follows—

1. This Act may be cited as the

Short title.

CUSTOMS (AMENDMENT) ACT, 2024,

and shall be read as one with the Customs Act No. 9 of 2015 hereinafter referred to as the “principal Act”.

2. Section 47 of the principal Act is amended by inserting after subsection (3) the following new subsection—

“(4) Where a person contravenes subsection (3), the Comptroller or a proper officer shall immediately file a Suspicious Activity Report with the Financial Intelligence Unit.”.

section 52 of

3. Section 52 (1) of the principal Act is amended by deleting “, other than passengers’ accompanied baggage,” where it appears.

Amendment of
section 94 of
principal Act.

4. Section 94 of the principal Act is amended by inserting after subsection (4) the following new subsections—

“(5) The Comptroller shall retain, or cause to be retained, the record obtained or created as a result of each transaction made pursuant to this Act, for a minimum period of five years from the date the record is obtained or created.

(6) Where the record is retained, obtained or created electronically, the record shall be retained in an electronically readable format for the period under subsection (5).”.

5. Section 176 of the principal Act is amended by inserting after subsection (3) the following new subsections—

“(4) Where a person contravenes subsection (1), the Comptroller or a proper officer shall immediately file a Suspicious Activity Report with the Financial Intelligence Unit.

(5) Without prejudice to section 9 (6), where a person contravenes subsection (1) in respect of goods being exported, the Comptroller or a proper officer may notify the Comptroller of Customs in the country of importation, or the relevant authority in accordance with the laws of that country, of the particulars of the contravention.”.
