**PLANT QUARANTINE ACT
 (CAP. 433)**

**Examination of Varieties of Agricultural Plant Species
 Regulations, 2006**

IN exercise of the powers conferred by article 32 of the Plant Quarantine Act, the Minister for Rural Affairs and the Environment has made the following regulations:-

1. (1) The title of these regulations is the Examination of Varieties of Agricultural Plant Species Regulations, 2006. Title and scope.

(2) The scope of these regulations is to ensure that varieties of species of agricultural plants which shall be included in the national catalogue of such varieties in Malta shall comply with internationally-recognised guidelines as regards the characteristics to be covered as a minimum by the examination and the minimum conditions for examining such varieties.

2. (1) Varieties of the agricultural plant species shall be officially accepted in the national catalogue within the meaning of regulation 8 (1) of the Seeds of Agricultural Plants and Vegetables Regulations, 2006 after fulfilling the requirements set out in the paragraphs below. Conditions for examination of varieties of agricultural plants. L.N. 81 of 2006.

(a) As regards distinctness, uniformity and stability,

(i) the species listed in Schedule I to these regulations shall comply with the conditions laid down in the "Protocols for distinctness, uniformity and stability tests" of the Administrative Council of the Community Plant Variety Office, (hereafter referred to as the 'CPVO') which are relevant for the particular species;

(ii) the species listed in Schedule II to these regulations shall comply with the "Guidelines for the conduct of tests for distinctness, homogeneity and stability" of the International Union for the Protection of New Varieties of Plants (hereafter referred to as 'UPOV') which are relevant for the particular species.

(b) As regards the value for cultivation or use, the varieties shall comply with the conditions laid down in Schedule III to these regulations without prejudice to regulation 8 (3) of the Seeds of Agricultural Plants and Vegetables Regulations, 2006.

(2) All the varietal characteristics within the meaning of sub-regulation (1) (a) (i) of this regulation and any characteristics in the 'UPOV' referred to in sub-regulation (1) (a) (ii) shall be used, provided that observation of a characteristic is not rendered impossible by the expression of any other characteristics and provided that the expression of a characteristic is not prevented by the environmental conditions under which the test is conducted.

(3) It shall be ensured that in respect of the species listed in Schedules I and II to these regulations, the minimum requirements for carrying out the examinations in respect of trial design and growing conditions, as laid down in the test guidelines referred to in the said Schedules, are fulfilled at the time of the examinations.

4. Quality characteristics.
