**PLANT QUARANTINE ACT
(CAP. 433)**

**Examination of Varieties of Agricultural Plant Species
(Amendment) Regulations, 2007**

IN exercise of the powers conferred by article 32 of the Plant Quarantine Act, 2001, the Minister for Rural Affairs and the Environment has made the following regulations:–

1. (1) The title of these regulations is the Examination of Varieties of Agricultural Plant Species (Amendment) Regulations, 2007 and they shall be construed as one with the Examination of Varieties of Agricultural Plant Species Regulations, 2006, hereinafter referred to as “the principal regulations”. Title. L.N. 246 of 2006.

(2) These regulations transpose the amendments included in Commission Directive 2007/48/EC.
