Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend and management of wildlife in the province of Balochistan consolidate the law relating to protection, preservation, conservation in the manner hereinafter appearing.

It is hereby enacted as follows:-

Short title extent and commencement.

1. (I) This Act may be called the Balochistan wildlife (Protection, preservation, conservation and mangement) Act, 1996.
2. It extends to the whole of the province of Balochistan (except the tribal area.)
3. It shall come into force at once.
4. Nothing hereinafter provided shall be deemed to authorize any person to hunt in the reserved or protected forests or protected wasteland as constituted and declared under the Balochistan Forest Act, 1996.

Definitions.

2. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions shall have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them, that is to say:-
 - (a) "Government" means the Government of Balochistan;
 - (b) "Officer" means (i) any person appointed in this behalf to carry out all or any of the purposes of this act or to do anything required by this Act or by any rule made the reunder to be done by an officer, (ii) any Forest Officer as defined in the Balochistan Forest Act, 1995;(iii) Director Wildlife and parks or nay of his offices authorised to carry out all a any purposes of this act.
 - (c) "Board" means the Balochistan wildlife management Board constituted under section 4.
 - (d) "Certificate" "Lisence" "Special Licence" "Permit" "Special permit", mean respectively, certificate a licence, a special licence, a permit, a special permit or a granted or issued under this Act or the Rules;
 - (e) "Meat" means the fat, blood, flesh or any edible part of a wild bird or animal, whether fresh or preserved;

- (f) "Trophy" means any dead wild bird or animal or any horn, antler, tooth, tusk, bone, claw, hoof, skin, hair, feather, egg, shell or other durable part of any wild bird or animal whether or not included in a manufactured or processed article;
- (g) "Dealer" when used in relation to wild birds and animals, trophies or meat shall mean any person who in the course of trade or business carries on by him whether on his own behalf or on behalf of any person:-
- (e) "Directorate" mean the Directorate of Wildlife and parks, Government of Balochistan.
- (i) sells, purchases or barter any wild bird or animal, trophy or meat:-
- (ii) cuts, carves, polishes, preserves, cleans, mounts or otherwise prepares any wild bird or animal, trophy or meat;
- (iii) manufactures any article from trophies or meat;
- (h) "Offence" means an offence punishable under this Act or under any rule made thereunder;
- (i) "Wildlife sanctuary" means the area declared as such under sub-section (i) of section 15;
- (j) "National park" means the area declared as such under section 16;
- (k) "Game Reserve" means an area declared as such under section 17;
- (l) "Protected Animals" means all animals, birds, reptiles mentioned in the third schedule appended to this act;
- (m) "Capture" means the taking alive of any wild animal;
- (n) "Game Animal" means a wild animal specified in the First Schedule of this act.
- (o) "Hunt" means any act directed immediately to the killing and capturing of a wild animal and shall include taking the nest or eggs of a wild animal;
- (p) "Private Game Reserve" means an area declared as such under section 18;
- (q) "Rules" means rules made under this Act;
- (r) "Schedule" means schedule appended to this Act;

- (s) "Wild Animal" means wild animals and wild birds specified in the First and the Third Schedule;
- (t) "Wildlife" includes organic resources, animals, birds, reptiles, and vegetation;
- Appointment of Officer** 3. (1) Government may for the purpose of this Act appoint any officers including honorary officers, on such team and coordination as it may determine to carry out the provisions of this Act.
- (2) Except as may otherwise be prescribed an honorary officer shall have all powers conferred by this Act and shall hold office for such period and subject to such conditions as may be prescribed. As soon as may be after the commencement of this Act.
- constitution of a Board or Directorate** 4. (1) Government shall establish a Board to be called Balochistan Wildlife Management Board with such constitution and functions as may be defined by the Government.
- (Places and in accordance with such provisions as may be prescribed.)
- Wild birds and animals not to be dealt without licence** 5. No person shall kill or possess any wild bird or animal or meat or trophy thereof, or attempt to kill or possess any wild bird or animal or meat or trophy thereof, specified in the first schedule except during the period specified in the schedule and under a licence and in the manner and to the extent provided therefore.
- snare, trap, net etc. not to be employed without permit** 6. No person shall:-
- (a) use or employ for the capture of wild birds and animals specified in the first schedule a snare, trap, net or other gear except for the following purposes:-
- (i) Government requirements;
- (ii) for breeding in Game sanctuaries, National Parks and Game Reserves;
- (b) hunt with the help of live decoys or call birds.

Hawks, falcons and dogs not to be possessed for killing wild birds or animals without a special licence.

No person shall:-

- (a) possess or use hawks, falcons for hawking, and killing wild birds and animals except under a licence to be issued by an authorized officer in such manner, on such terms and conditions and on payment of such fees as may be prescribed;
- (b) possess or use dogs for coursing wild animals and birds specified in the First schedule except under a licence issued by an authorized officer in such manner, on such terms and conditions and on payment of such fees as may be prescribed;

(2) The Board shall be a body corporate having perpetual succession and a common seal with power to acquire and hold property and shall be the said name shed or he shed.

(3) The Board shall consist of.

- (i) A examine,; and
- (ii) Such number of member as may be appointed by the Government..

(4) Chief Minister of the Province shall be the ex-officer Chairman of the Board.

(5) A member shall, under he sooner resigns or is removed by the Government, hold office for such term as may be prescribed.

(6) The Chairman may appoint any person as the Secretary of the board.

(7) The meeting of the Board shall be held at such times and such.

Function of the Board.

(8) The function of the board shall be;

- (a) To take all policy decision about the conservation and development of wildlife and game management in the province.
- (b) to scrutinize and approve all the development schemes relating to the wildlife and game management in the province;
- (c) to supervise the progress of the development activities in the field of wildlife protection; and management and to submit the annual progress report submitted in this behalf; and
- (d) to undertake such other function as may be prescribed.

Board Fund

- (a) There shall be a fund to be known as "proved fund" vested in the Board. The fund shall be remain and administated in such manner as may be prscribed;
- (b) All moneys at the credit of the Board shall be kept in such custody as may be prscribed;
- (c) the Board shall maintain complete and acurate bodies of accounts in such form as may be prscribed;
- (d) The accounts of the board shall be audited in such man as may be prscribed
- (e) Copies of audit reports shall be sent to government with comments of the board;
- (f) The board shall take necessary steps for rectification of an audit objection and carry out any direction issued in this behalf by government.

**Returns and 8
Statements.**

- (10) Government may require the board to furnish it with any document, return statement, estiamte, information or report regarding any matter under the control of the board and the board shall comply with every such requisition.

Restrictions on hunting.

- 8: No person shall:-
- (a) hunt any wild animal by means of set-gun, drop-spear, deadfall, guntrap, explosive, projectile, bomb, grenade, baited hook, or any other trap, whatsoever;
 - (b) hunt any game animal by means of an automatic weapon or a weapon of a calibre used by the Pakistan Army or police Force or by means of a projectile containing any drug or chemical substance having the properties of an aesthetiser, paralysing, stupify or rendering an animal incapacable, whether partly or totally;
 - (c) hunt any game animal except under a persist and in accordance with the provisions of this Act or the rules made thereunder provided that no person shall hunt any game animal other than a bird or hare, with a shot-gun or a non-magum rifle of 22 calibre or less;
 - (d) Use, or have in his possession, any net, snare, Bhagwa poison or like injurious substance for the purpose of hunting game animal;
 - (e) Use any motor vehicle, motor-driven vessel, watercraft, of any type, aircraft or any other manually or machancally propelled vehicle of any type of pursue, drive or stampede, game animal for any purpose whatsoever;
 - (f) Shoot any game animal except wild boar and vermin from any aircraft, motor vehicle, railtrolley, cart, board or any kind of watercraft or any other conveyance or from within two hundred metres of such conveyance;
 - (g) Hunt any wild animal with the help of live decoys or call-birds; except quail;
 - (h) Construct, use or have in his possession for the purpose of hunting any game animal, any pitfall, gamepit, trench or similar excavation, fence or enclosure, or use bhagwa or any other contrivance except duck blinds;

Provided that an authorised officer may, in his discretion, exempt any persons from one or more of the provisions of this section;

Provided further that any wild animal may be driven away from an aerodrome or airstrip by using a motor vehicle or an aircraft if it is necessary to ensure safety of the aircraft using that aerodrome or airstrip.

- Animal found dead or killed or caught unlawfully, to be the property of the Govt. 9. Any protected animal or game animal which is found dead or dying or which has been killed or caught otherwise than in accordance with the provisions of this Act and any meat or trophy thereof shall be the property of Government.
- Wild birds and animals that shall not be killed hunted or captured 10. No person shall kill, hunt or capture any wild bird or animal specified in the third schedule.
- Certificate of lawful possession 11. No person shall be in possession of any wild animal, dead or alive, trophy or meat of a kind specified in the second schedule unless he be in possession of a licence granted in respect thereof by an officer authorised in this behalf in accordance with rules framed under this Act.
- Restriction on transfer of animals, trophies or meat. 12. (i) No person shall transfer by gift, sale or otherwise to any other person any animal, trophy or meat of a kind specified in section 11 unless he be in possession of a licence in respect thereof; and such licence is endorsed with details of the transaction and given to the transferee at the time of transfer.
(2) No person shall receive by gift, purchase or otherwise any animal, trophy or meat specified in section 11 unless he receives at the same time a valid licence of lawful possession thereof.
- Restriction on import and export of animals trophies or meat. 13. (1) No person shall import or attempt to import into Balochistan any wild animal or bird of endemic or exotic species, or trophy or meat of a kind specific in section 11 except under an import permit granted under this Act and, if such import be for outside Pakistan, except through a custom post of entry subject to any law relating to control on import for the time being in force.
(2) No person shall export or attempt to export out of Balochistan any animal, trophy or meat specified in section 11 except under an export permit granted under this Act, if such export be to any country outside Pakistan except through a custom post of exit and subject to any law relating to control on export for the time being in force.
- Restriction on dealing in animals, trophies or meat. 14. No person shall, as a profession, trade or business buy, sell or otherwise deal in wild animals, trophies or meat thereof or process or manufacture goods or articles for such trophies or meat, unless he is in possession of a valid licence (hereinafter called a dealers licence) to do so, issued by an officer authorised in this behalf in accordance with the provision of rules made under this Act.

Wildlife Sanctuary.

15. (1) With a view to securing undisturbed breeding of wildlife, the Government may, by notification in the official Gazette, declare any area to be a wildlife sanctuary and may demarcate it in such manner as may be prescribed.

(2) The wildlife sanctuary shall be set aside as undisturbed breeding ground, for the protection of wildlife and access thereto for public shall, except in accordance with the rules, be prohibited.

(3) No person shall:-

- (i) enter or reside in a game sanctuary;
- (ii) cultivate any land in a game sanctuary;
- (iii) damage or destroy any vegetation in a game sanctuary;

(iv) hunt, kill or capture any wild bird or animal in game sanctuary or fire any gun or other firearm within one and a half kilometer of the boundaries of a game sanctuary;

(v) introduce any endemic or exotic species of any animal or plant or allow domestic animal to graze or stray in the area;

(vi) cause any fire to be lit in the area;

(vii) pollute water flowing in and through the game sanctuary;

Provided that the Government may for scientific purposes or for aesthetic enjoyment or betterment of scenery authorise the doing of the aforementioned prohibited acts.

National Park

16 (1) With a view to protecting and preserving scenery, flora and fauna in natural state, the Government may by notification in the official gazette declare any area which is the property of the Govt. or over which it has proprietary rights to be a national park and demarcate it in such a manner as may be prescribed where the following acts shall not be allowed:-

(i) hunting, shooting, trapping, killing or capturing any wild bird or animal in a National Park or within a radius of two kilometers from its boundary;

(ii) firing any gun or firearm or doing any other act which interferes with the breeding places or any wild bird or animal;

(iii) felling, tapping, burning or in any way damaging or destroying, taking, collecting or removing any plant or tree therefrom;

(iv) clearing or breaking up of any land for cultivation; mining or for any other purpose;

- (v) polluting water flowing in or through the National Park;

Provided that the Government may for scientific purpose or betterment of the National Park or any other purpose authorise the doing of any of the above mentioned prohibited acts.

- (2) A national park shall be accessible to public for recreation, education and research, subject to such restrictions as Govt: may impose.

(3) Provision of access roads and construction of rest houses, hatcheries and other buildings in the "National park" along with amenities for public may be so made and the forest therein shall be so managed as not to impair the object of establishment of the "National Park".

Game Reserve.

17. With a view to providing facilities for hunting, the Government may by notification in the official gazette declare any area to be a Game Reserve.
- (i) No person shall hunt, shoot or capture any wild animal in a Game Reserve except in the case of game animals specified in the First Schedule, under a hunting permit.
- (ii) A hunting permit may be issued by an authorized officer in such manner, on such terms and conditions and on payment of such fees as may be prescribed.
- (iii) The holder of a hunting permit may hunt such number of game animals specified in the First Schedule and during such period as may be specified by the authorized officer;
- (iv) Introduce any domestic animal or allow any domestic animal to stray;
- (v) Damage or destroy any vegetation or clear or break up any land for cultivation, mining or for any other purpose;

Provided that the Government may for scientific purpose or for the betterment of the Game Reserve or for the exploitation of forest produce or for any other purpose authorize the doing of any of the aforementioned prohibited acts;

Provided further that alteration in boundaries may be allowed by the authorities, competent to constitute the Game Sanctuary, National Park and Game Reserve.

- Private Game Reserves.** 18. (1) Where Government is satisfied that an area of private land has been dedicated by its owner for the purpose similar to a Game Reserve, it may on the application of the owner of the area declare such area to be a private game reserve through a notification in the official gazette;
- (2) This area will become a private game reserve from the date of issue of the notification mentioned in sub-section (i)
- (3) Hunting and shooting of wild animals by any person other than the owner of the land shall not be allowed in a private game reserve except with the permission of the owner thereof, provided that if the population of a certain species in the said game reserve falls below the optimum level determined by the Government even the owner will not be entitled to hunt or shoot or capture the wild animal;
- (4) The owner of a private game reserve shall exercise within the limits of his game reserve, the same powers as are exercisable by an officer under this Act;
- (5) The Government may by notification in the official gazette, at any time declare that any private game reserve shall cease to be a private game reserve;
- Abetment of an offence** 19. (i). An abetment of any offence under this Act shall be punishable as the main offence.
(2) Interference by any one in due discharge of the duties of the employees appointed under this Act shall be unlawful.
- Penalties.** 20. (1) Whosoever contravenes:-7,8,9.
(i) any provision of section 10,11,12,13 and 14 shall be punishable with imprisonment which may extend to a period of two years or with fine which may extend to five thousand rupees, or with both subject to minimum impressment of one year and a fine of 1000 rupees and suspension of any licence or permit granted or issued to him under this Act for a period of five years;
- (ii) any violation of section 15,16 and 17 shall be punishable with imprisonment which may extend to five years or with fine of ten thousand rupees, or with both subject to a minimum impressment of two years and a fine of five thousand rupees with confiscation of weapons or a vehicle used in such contravention.
- (iii) any violation of section 26 shall be punishable with a fine which may extend to five hundred rupees;

(iv) any provision of this Act or any rule for the contravention of which no specific penalty is provided shall be punishable with imprisonment for a term which may extend to six months or with fine which may extend to five hundred rupees or with both.

(2). Whoever interferes or attempts to interfere in the performance of any functions or in the discharge of any duties under this Act shall be punished as in clause (i) of sub section (1).

(3). Whoever having already been convicted of an offence under sub section (1) or sub section (2) is again convicted thereunder, shall on every subsequent conviction be, punished with imprisonment which shall not be less than two years or fine which shall not be less than five thousand rupees or both and his firearm, vehicle, appliances or anything used in the commission of the offence and his hunting licence shall be confiscated and he shall not be entitled to a hunting licence for a period of ten years.

Killing, capturing in selfdefence.

21. (i) Not withstanding any other provisions of this Act it shall not be an offence:-
- (a) for any person to kill any wild animal by any means in the immediate defence of his own life or that of any other person;
- (b) for the owner of standing crops or livestock or his employee to kill any wild bird or animal that is doing damage for the crop or livestock by any means within a reasonable distance or where the livestock is grazing or where it is enclosed for the night

Onus of proof

22. When any proceedings taken under this Act or in consequence of anything done under this Act, a question arises with respect to any wild animal, trophy or meat it shall be presumed to be the property of Government until the contrary is proved.

Power to search without warrant.

23. Any officer or any other person authorised by the Government in this behalf, may search any person, premise, vessel, vehicle, package, receptacle or covering so as to satisfy himself whether or not an offence under this Act has been committed.

Power of seizure.

24. Any officer or any person authorised by the Government in this behalf, may seize any wild animal, dead or alive, together with any firearm, net, trap, snare, bow, arrow or any vehicle or vessel or anything whatsoever used or suspected to have been used in the commission of an offence under this Act.

- Procedure as to perishable property seized under-section 24. 25. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Act the officer or any other person authorised in this behalf may sell any property seized under section 24 which is subject to speedy and natural decay and may subject to the determination of the rights thereto deal with the proceeds in such manner as may be prescribed.
- Duty to produce licence or permit on demand by any officer or person authorised in this behalf. 26. Every person in possession of any wild bird or animal specified in the first schedule shall produce his licence or permit as the case may be, on a demand made by an officer of the department or any other person authorised by Government in this behalf.
- Procedure when the offender is not known or cannot be found. 27. When the offender is not known or cannot be found any officer authorised in this behalf may if he finds that an offence has been committed, confiscate the property used in the commission of the offence.
- Power to arrest. 28. (1) Any officer or any other person authorised in this behalf may without orders from a magistrate and without a warrant, arrest any person against whom a reasonable suspicion exists of his having been concerned in any offence under this Act.
(2) Every officer making an arrest under this section shall without unnecessary delay and subject to the provisions of this Act as to release on bond, take or send the person arrested before the Magistrate having jurisdiction in the case or the officer-in-charge of the nearest police station.
- Power to release on bond a person arrested. 29. Any officer not below the rank of Forest Ranger/Asstt Director wildlife or of an equivalent rank who has arrested any person under the provisions of section 28 may release such person on his executing a bond to appear if and when so required, before the Magistrate having jurisdiction in the case or before the officer-in-charge of the nearest police station.
- Persons who may lodge complaints and take cognizance of offence. 30. Cognizance of an offence under this Act shall such be taken by any Government except on the complaint of the officer or any person authorised by Government in this behalf.
- Confiscation 31. The Court may order the confiscation of the weapon, net, trap, snare employed or suspected to have been employed in the commission of an offence under this Act.
- Court which is competent to take cognizance of offence 32. No Court inferior to that of a Magistrate of the first class shall try any offence punishable under this Act.

- Power to try offences summarily.**
33. Not with standing anything to the contrary contemned in the code of criminal procedure 1898. The District Magistrate or any Magisitrade of the first class specially empowered in this behalf by Government may try sunnararily, any offence, punishable under this Act.
- Power to compound offences.**
34. (1) The Government may, by notification in the official Gazette, empower any officer appointed under this Act:-
- (a) to accept from any person against whom a reasonable suspicion exists that he has committed any offence under this Act, sum of mony by way of compensation for such offence.
- (b) When any property has been seized as liable to confiscation, to release the same on payment of the value thereof, as estimated by such officer.
- (2) On the payment of compensation or such sum of money, or such value of property under sub-section(1) or both, as the case may be, the suspected person if in custody, shall be discharged and the property, if any seized shall be released and no further proceedings shall be taken against such person or property.
- (3) The sum of money accepted as compensation under clause (a) of sub-section (1) shall in no case exceed the sum of five thousand rupees.
- (4) No officer shall have power to compound a second and subsequent offence under this Act.
- Government may invest officers with certain powers.**
35. Government may invest any officer or any other person authorised in this behalf with all or any of the following powers, that is to say:-
- (a) the powers of civil court to compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of documents and material objects;
- (b) the power to issue a search warrant under the Code of Criminal procedure, 1989 (Act V of 1898);
- (c) the power to hold an inquiry into offences under this Act and in teh course of such inquiry to receive and record evidence; and
- (d) the powers to prosecute a case before a Magistrate.

- Officers to be public servants. 36. The officers or persons authorised under any provisions of this Act to do a certain thing or act in a certain manner shall be deemed to be public servants within the meaning of the Pakistan Penal Code (Act XLV of 1860).
- Protection of action taken under this Act. 37. No suit, prosecution or other legal proceedings shall lie against any officer for anything in good faith done or intended to be done in pursuance of any provisions of this Act or the rules made thereunder.
- Duty of police and Levies officers. 38. Every police officer and every Levies employee, shall, upon a request made by any person employed under this Act, assist him in the due discharge of his duties under this Act.
- Delegation of powers. 39. Government may, by notification in the official Gazette delegate all or any of the powers conferred upon him under the provisions of this Act to any officer subordinate to it.
- Power of grant exemption. 40. Notwith standing anything contained in this Act Government may, in the interest of scientific or public purpose, allow by notification in the official Gazette, killing and capturing of such wild bird or animal in any specified place by any specified means.
- Power to add to or exclude from schedules 41. Government may, by notification in the official Gazette, in respect to any specified area-
- (i) add to or exclude from the Schedules any wild bird or animal, subject to such conditions as it may impose in each case;
 - (ii) alter the period during which any wild bird or animal specified in the first Schedule may be killed.
- Power to make rules. 42. (i) Government may, make rule for the purpose of carrying into effect the provisions of this Act.
(2) In particular and without prejudice to the generality of the forgoing power, such rules may provide for:-
- (a) the function and powers of the Board; the powers and duties of the officers and other persons, specially authorised to perform functions under this Act;
 - (c) the form in which, the terms and conditions on which, a certificate licence, special licence, a permit or a special permit may be granted;
 - (d) the fees to be charged for any licence or permit or special licence or special permit;

- (e) in the case of any species of wild birds and animals, the number and the sex that may be killed under a special permit; and the manner and the method under which wild birds and animals are killed or hunted under a special permit;
- (f) grant reward to persons who render help in detection of offences under this Act;
- (g) the authorities by whom, and the conditions on which, and the manner in which, licences, may be issued or obtained, as the case may be;
- (h) the management of Wildlife Sanctuaries, National Parks and Game Reserves;
- (i) tenure of office, resignation and terms and conditions of members of the Board;
- (j) the recruitment, tenure of office, terms and conditions of service of the officers and servants appointed by the Board;
- (k) the delegation of administrative and financial powers to members, Secretary, officers and servants of the Board or the officers of the Directorate of Wildlife and Parks.
- (L) any other matter required under any of the provisions of this Act to be prescribed.

Dissolution the Board.

43. Government may by notification in the official Gazette, declare that the Board shall be dissolved on such date and with such consequences as may be specified in the notification.

Repeal and savings.

44. (i) The following enactment in its application to the province of Balochistan is hereby repealed:-

The Balochistan Wildlife protection Act 1974.

- (2) Notwithstanding the repeal of the enactment mentioned in subsection (1), every thing done, action take, obligation, liability, penalty or punishment incurred, inquiry or proceeding commenced, officer appointed or person authorised, jurisdiction or power conferred, rule made and licence or order issued under the provisions of the said enactment or rules made thereunder shall continue in force and, so far as may be deemed to have been, respectively done, taken incurred, commenced, appointed, authorised, conferred, made or issued under this Act and any enactment or document referring to any of the said provisions shall, as far as may be construed to refer to this Act to the corresponding provision thereof.

BALUCHISTAN WILDLIFE PROTECTION RULES, 1995.

In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 42 of the Balochistan Wildlife (protection, Preservation, Conservation and Management) Act, 1995 (Act No.....of 1995) the Government of Balochistan is Pleased to make the following rules namely:-

(i) "Act" means Balochistan Wildlife Protection, preservation Conservation and Management Act. 1995.
(ii) "from" means a from appended to these rules.
(iii) "schedule" means a schedule appended to the Act. |
| Validity of licence or permit. | 3. Every licence or permit issued under these rules shall be valid upto 31st December each calendar year or otherwise expires on the dates mentioned thereon and shall be valid for Balochistan Province only. |

Officers empowered to issue licence or permit.

4. All licences or permits under the Act shall be issued or renewed by the Divisional Forest officers or Sub-Divisional Forest Officers or Assistant Director Wildlife. All special permits, (import or export permits under the Act shall be issued by the Chief Conservator of Conservator of Forest Balochistan or Director Wildlife Balochistan).

The licences or permits shall have pasted there in a photograph and the prescribed fees shall be paid in cash.

Provided that a licensee shall not be required to present photograph for the purposes of holding the licence, to the licence issuing authority, where photograph facilities are not available.

Grant of licence to V.I.P's

5. The Chief Conservator or Conservator of Forest Director Wildlifes Divisional Forest Officers or the Sub-Divisional Forest Officers may grant shooting o possession licence free of charge to a distinguished foreign visitor or a member of the Diplomatic corps or the Head of the acceding state as the case may be.

Forest Officers, Magistrates and Police Officer not below the rank of Sub-Inspector are authorised to require the production of a licence or permit and lodge complaint.

Serving of Wild animals/birds meat in hotels etc.

6. No person shall cook or serve in any public place, hotel, cafe, restaurant, hostels, boarding houses, or any other catering place any wild bird or animal mentioned in the First Schedule of the Act, When the birds or animals have been shot in accordance with the rules and during the period specified for each species.

Search with- out warrant.

7. All Forest Officer not below the rank of Forest Ranger and Asstt Director Wildlife are authorised to/search any person, vessel, railway, aircraft, animal, vehicle, packages, receptacles etc. to satisfy himself whether or not any offence under the Act has been committed.

Seizure.

8. All Forest Officer, not below the rank of Forest Ranger or Asstt Director Wildlife may take possession of birds, animals (dead or alive), weapons, traps, nets, snares used or suspected to have been used in the commission of an offence under the Act.

Procedure to compound offence

9. (1) The Divisional Forest Officer, or Assistant Director Wildlife may release the property seized under rule 8 on compounding the case for the first time only by a certain person in a manner laid down:-

(a) to accept from any person against whom a reasonable suspicion exists that he has committed offences under Sections 5,6,7,8,10,11,12,13,14, sub-section (3) of Section 15,16,and 17 of Balochistan Wildlife protection Act, 1996 a sum of money by way of compensation for the offence which such person is suspected to have committed.

(b) When any property has been seized as liable to confiscation to release the same on payment of the value thereof as estimated by such officer.

(2) On the payment of such sum of money, or such value, or both as the case may be, to such officer, the suspected person, if in custody, shall be discharged, the property, if any seized shall be released, and no further proceedings shall be taken against such person or property.

(3) A Forest officer shall not be empowered under this section unless he is a Forest officer of a rank not inferior to that of and the sum of money accepted as compensation under clause(a) of sub-section(1), shall in no case exceed the sum of five hundred rupees.

(4) Subsequent commission of offence by the same person shall be challaned in the Court of Magistrate First Class.

Trapping near Game Reserves or Sanctuaries.

(10) No person shall kill, shoot, trap, snare any wild bird or animal within a Game Sanctuary or Game Reserve or 1,5 K.M. from the boundaries of a Game Sanctuary or Game Reserve even if he has a licence or permit.

Shooting in Game Reserves

(11) a special permit granted by the Chief Conservator/Director Wildlife Balochistan for shooting birds in a Game Reserve on payment of prescribed fee shall not entitle the holder to Kill more than 15 birds. Where a party of four or more special permit holders join by shoot in the same Game Reserve, they shall not be revalidated.

Shooting and hunting hours

(12) No one shall go out for hunting, shooting after sunset shall lie in waiting near the water points for this purpose. No one shall kill any wild bird or animal by chasing with a vehicle or by the aid of artificial light.

possession licence.

(13) No person shall go out for the purpose of shooting, hunting, coursing with grey hounds or hawking wild birds or animals unless he possesses requisite licence with him (Form A or Form B-Annexure I&II).

The licence fee for coursing with grey hounds, and for hawking, payable yearly, shall be as under:-

- (i) for the possession of or coursing with grey hounds.-
Rs30/per dog.
- (ii) for the possession of or hunting with:-

Baz or Jurra. ..Rs. 1000/per bird
Falcon ..Rs. 5000/per bird.
Basha or Shikra..Rs. 1000/per bird.

Fee for general shooting licence

(14) The general shooting licence shall be issued to the applicant no production of valid shotgun or rifle licence in his name. A retainer shall have to obtain a separate licence in his own name. (Form C-Annexure III).

(a) The yearly fee for general shooting licence shall be Rs.500/- per season. The licencees shall shoot only birds or animals as specified in the First Schedule of the Act.

(b) Shooting licence for birds, except under 3rd schedule Rs 1000/= annum

(c) Shooting for Game animals for Rs 1000/= per annum (except under 3rd schedule)

Fee for possession of animals or birds.

(15). A possession licence for wild birds or animals, or trophies or skins is non-transferable. If a wild bird, animal, trophy or skin is sold or given as a gift to other persons the purchaser or the receiver shall append the licence or permit of the selling or gift giving party with his application, which shall be cancelled. A new possession licence shall be issued to the applicant on payment of the following fee (Form D-Annexure IV):-

(17) A dealer's licence shall be issued by the Divisional Forest Officers or the Asst. Director Wildlife only on cash payment of the following fee and the dealer shall comply with the provisions of Section 7,8,10, and 11 of the Act. He shall also maintain a register of dealings as directed. He will issue a receipt to the buyers of animals or birds which shall be appended by him while applying for possession licence (Form G- Annexure VIII):-

Fee for trapping permits.

(18) (1) Any person, local authority, statutory organisation or Government Department desiring a permit for the capture of wild birds or animals under Section 6, shall submit an application in writing to Government, stating:-

- (c) the nature of capturing operations.
- (d) the days when these operations will be carried out, and
