



COMMISSION RESOLUTION NO. 2021-003

RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE RESULTS FRAMEWORK OF THE CLIMATE CHANGE COMMISSION TO INCREASE ITS RESPONSIVENESS IN FULFILLING ITS MANDATES UNDER REPUBLIC ACT (RA) NO. 9729, AS AMENDED, AND OTHER EXISTING LAWS

WHEREAS, Executive Order (EO) No. 5 series of 2016, entitled *Approving and Adopting the Twenty-Five Year Long Term Vision Entitled Ambisyon Natin 2040 as Guide for Development Planning*, articulated the need for "bold vision and effective development planning" based on a "forward-looking approach" towards a "*matatag, maginhawa at panatag na buhay*" for the Filipino people;

WHEREAS, according to the Global Climate Risk Index 2021 by the Germanwatch, the Philippines was ranked fourth among countries most affected by extreme weather events from 2000-2019;

WHEREAS, Section 4 of Republic Act No. 9729 (RA No. 9729), otherwise known as the Climate Change Act of 2009, as amended by Republic Act No. 10174, provides that the Climate Change Commission shall be "the lead policy-making body of the government, which shall be tasked to coordinate, monitor and evaluate the programs and action plans of the government in order to ensure the mainstreaming of climate change into the national, sectoral and local development plans and programs";

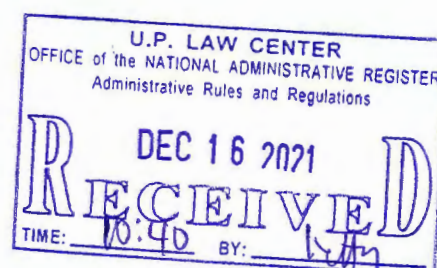
WHEREAS, Section 8 of RA No. 9729, as amended, created the Climate Change Office (CCO) to be the main support unit of the Commission providing administrative and technical support for the fulfillment of functions and exercise of its powers;

WHEREAS, during its 3rd Regular Commission Meeting held on 04 December 2020, the Commission approved the Urgent Work Ahead and End-to-End Support System to increase institutional readiness to transition and transform the country from being climate-vulnerable to climate-smart;

WHEREAS, during the same meeting, the Commission approved the Results Framework to guide the work and target setting, budget and appropriate organizational structure of the Commission;

WHEREAS, the Commission seeks to conform to the thrusts of the Updated Philippine Development Plan 2017-2022 on ensuring a people-centered, clean, and effective governance in consideration of the National Government Right Sizing Program requiring agencies to rationalize their staffing pattern with their mandates and functions, and in consideration of other agencies' mandates and functions to eliminate duplication and to promote convergence;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Commission adopt the attached Results Framework to increase the agency's responsiveness in fulfilling its mandates and to enable results-based management in the exercise of its functions;



RESOLVED FURTHER, that the Commission update this Results Framework before 2022 to consider the outcome of its institutional medium-to-long term planning and to ensure responsiveness to its mandates under other existing laws such as Republic Act No. 10771, otherwise known as the Philippine Green Jobs Act of 2016 and Republic Act No. 11285, otherwise known as the Energy Efficiency and Conservation Act, and the implementation of the Nationally Determined Contribution;

RESOLVED FINALLY, for the Climate Change Office, through the Office of the Executive Director, to submit and present a workplan for operationalizing the Results Framework within thirty (30) calendar days, for the approval of the Commission.
