Public Health (Amendment) Act 1998,

Being an Act to amend the *Public Health Act* (Chapter 226),

MADE by the National Parliament to come into operation in accordance with a notice in the National Gazette by the Head of State, acting with, and in accordance with, the advice of the Minister.

1. INTERPRETATION (AMENDMENT OF SECTION 1).

Section 1 of the Principal Act is amended by repealing the definition of "Local Medical Authority" and replacing it with the following:

"'Local Medical Authority' means a Local Medical Authority appointed under the *National Health Administration Act 1997*;"

2. REPEAL OF SECTION 4.

Section 4 of the Principal Act is repealed.

3. REPEAL OF SECTION 5.

Section 5 of the Principal Act is repealed.

4. ASSISTANT LOCAL MEDICAL AUTHORITIES (AMENDMENT OF SECTION 7).

Section 7 of the Principal Act is amended -

- (a) in line 1, by inserting before the words "the Minister" the symbols and figure "(1)"; and
- (b) by adding the following new Subsection:-

"(2) An Assistant Local Medical Authority appointed under Subsection (i) -

Public Health (Aministration)

- (a) is answerable to, and subject to the directions of, the Local Medical Authority; and
- (b) has such powers and functions as are delegated to him under this Act by the Local Medical Authority.”.
