IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 50 of the Local Government Act, Chapter 257, the Barrouallie Town Board makes the following By-Laws:

BARROUALLIE TOWN BOARD (MARKET) BY-LAWS 2010

1. These By-Laws may be cited as the Barrouallie Town Board Citation (Market) By-Laws, 2010.

2. In these By-Laws:

Interpretation

"Clerk" means the Clerk of the Board;

"Board" means the Barrouallie Town Board;

"market dues" means the market dues set out in Schedule 1;

"produce" includes anything whether live or dead produced in the course of agriculture;

"stall" includes any shop, counter, bench, stand or other erection, and any space set apart for the reception of any article, thing or produce.

3. The days on which and the hours between which the market established in the Town may be opened and kept open shall be as follows:

Weekdays and Saturdays other than public holidays: 6:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m.

Sundays and public holidays: 6:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m.

4. (1) No person shall sell, offer for sale or expose for the purpose of sale any produce in the Town or within one mile from the limits of the Town, other than in the market.

(2) Any person who contravenes this by-law commits an offence.

	(3) This by-law shall not apply to a person selling or disposing of any produce at his residence, shop or store.	
Stalls	5. (1) The Clerk shall cause all stalls in the market to be numbered in plain and legible characters and to be registered in a book to be kept for that purpose.	
	(2) The book referred to in subsection (1) shall also contain the name of every tenant of a stall, the date when each tenancy commenced, the amount of market dues payable, the date when each tenancy ceased and the cause of ceasing.	
Tenancy of stall	6. (1) The tenancy of every stall in the market may be by the day, week, month or year and the appropriate market dues shall in all cases be payable in advance.	
	(2) In default of payment of market dues, the tenant if in possession may be ejected by the Clerk, who may in addition to any remedy for the collection of market dues, seize and sell any article, thing or produce in the stall that is sufficient for payment thereof.	
Removal of property	7. If the tenant of any stall, on giving up possession, or being ejected, does not forthwith remove all property belonging to him. such property may be removed by the Clerk and sold at the expiration of seven days from the date of such removal unless claimed within that period and all expenses incurred reimbursed to the Clerk except that any perishable article so removed may be sold immediately.	
Sub-letting	8. (1) No tenant of a stall shall sub-let the stall to any other person.	
	(2) Where any tenant sub-lets a stall in contravention of this by-law, his tenancy shall be deemed to have been terminated, and the person in occupation of the stall shall, upon being requested by the Clerk to do so, vacate the stall and remove all property belonging to him.	
	(3) Where a person fails to vacate his stall and remove his property when requested to do so, the Clerk may eject the person and cause his property to be removed from the market.	
Stall to be kept clean	9. (1) Every tenant of a stall shall at all times keep the stall and the front, rear, sides and roof, if any, clean and free from filth and dirt of every kind.	
	(2) Where any tenant refuses or neglects to so do, the Clerk shall cause the stall to be cleaned and the expenses incurred in so doing may be recovered by the Clerk from the tenant by seizure and sale at auction by the Clerk of any article, thing or produce in the stall sufficient for the payment and the tenant shall in addition commit an offence.	

10. The Clerk shall ensure that stalls in the market are properly cleaned every day before the closing of the market.	Stall to be kep clean before closing of market
11. (1) No person shall sell, offer for sale or expose for the purpose of sale any article, thing or produce in the market:	Conditions fo sale in marke
(a) until after market dues have been paid; and	
(o) unless he produces a medical certificate of fitness.	
(2) A person who is suffering from an infectious or contagious disease shall not sell in the market.	
(3) Every person disposing of any article, thing or produce in the market shall produce the receipt issued by the Clerk to any agent of the Board immediately on being requested to do so.	
(4) A person who contravenes this by-law commits an offence.	
12. The market dues set out in Schedule I are payable for rental of a stall in the market.	Market dues Schedule 1
13. (1) A person shall not expose for sale in any street or in any public place in the Town or within one mile from the limits of the Town other than in the market, or other place approved by the Board any meat, fish, whalemeat or turtle.	Sale of fish and meat
(2) Nothing in this by-law shall prevent any person from disposing of any tinned meat or salted fish in any shop or in the course of any auction of general effects.	
14. (1) No person shall slaughter or cause to be slaughtered any animal for the purpose of selling the carcass within the Town or within one mile from the limits of the Town other than in the market or other place approved by the Board.	Slaughtering animals
(2) Every person who desires to have an animal slaughtered in the market shall, before the animal is slaughtered, pay to the Clerk the appropriate slaughterhouse dues set out in Schedule 2.	Schedule 2
(3) Every animal to be slaughtered shall first be inspected by the Sanitary Inspector and passed fit for human consumption.	

(4) No animal shall be slaughtered in the market before the hour of 5:00 a.m.

(5) A person who contravenes this by-law commits an offence.

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15. (1) No person shall sell or offer for sale in the market any meat except at the stall set aside for that purpose.

(2) Any person who sells or exposes for sale any meat in contravention of this by-law commits an offence.

Butcher to wear clean	16. Every butcher shall:	
apparel	(a) keep his stall clean;	
	(b) wear an apron;	
	(c) provide himself with clean towels; and	
	 (d) keep his scales, weights and other appliances in a clean and sanitary condition. 	
Fish	17. (1) Boats bringing fresh or corned fish intended for sale in the Town shall, on arrival, be beached only on that portion of the sea frontage reserved for that purpose.	
	(2) A person shall sell fish only on the counters provided in the market for that purpose.	
	(3) A person who contravenes this by-law commits an offence.	
Weighing of articles	18. All articles, things or produce sold in the market shall be properly weighed, and in the cases of dispute with the respect to the weight of any article, thing, or produce the seller, if required to do so by a prospective purchaser, shall cause such article, thing or produce to be weighed in the presence of the Clerk or other officer authorized by the Board.	
Preservation of order	19. Every person resorting to the market as buyer, seller or otherwise shall at all times comply with reasonable directions of the Clerk or other officer responsible for the maintenance of order in the market or the due observance of these By-Laws.	
Ejecting offenders from market	20. The Clerk may without using more force than is necessary in the circumstances eject or cause to be ejected any person contravening these By-Laws except that such ejection from the market shall not be a bar to any subsequent criminal proceedings.	
Dogs prohibited	21. (1) No person shall bring a dog, or permit a dog to follow him into or remain with him in the market.	
	(2) The Clerk may eject or cause to be ejected any dog found in the market.

 \$2.00 per day or part thereof.

SLAUGHTER HOUSE DUES

1.	For every bull, ox, or heifer	\$15.00 per animal.
2.	For every pig, goat, or sheep	\$5.00 per animal.
