414 of 2015 | 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Wildlife Conservation (Tourist Hunting) (Amendment) Regulations, 2019 and shall be read as one with the Wildlife Conservation (Tourist Hunting) Regulations hereinafter referred to as the “principal Regulations”. |

135 of 2014 | 2. The principal Regulations are amended in regulation 2 by-
(a) adding the definition of the term “Board” in the appropriate alphabetical order:
“Board” means the Board of Directors of Tanzania Wildlife Management Authority established by the Wildlife Conservation (Tanzania Wildlife Management Authority) Establishment Order;”
(b) deleting the definition of the terms “conservation fees” and “observer fee” and substituting for them the following:
“conservation fees” means an amount of money paid by a hunting client for extra days spent in the hunting block.
“observer fee” means a fee paid by an observer during hunting through a hunting company to observe hunting activities;” |

regulation 3 | 3. The principal Regulations are amended in regulation 3(2) by deleting the words “together with” and substituting for them the words “in accordance to” |

Amendment of
regulation 5

4. The principal Regulations are amended in regulation 5 by deleting sub-regulation (2) and substituting for it the following:

“(2) The Director shall categorize hunting blocks in three categories in accordance with the Grade Points Average score of each hunting block calculated from the criteria specified in the Tenth Schedule as follows-

- (a) Category I comprise of hunting blocks with Grade Point Average Score ranging from 3.1 to 3.6;
- (b) Category II comprise of hunting blocks with Grade Point Average Score ranging from 2.4 to 3.0;
- (c) Category III comprise of hunting blocks with Grade Point Average Score ranging from 1.7 to 2.3”.

regulation 7

5. The principal Regulations are amended by adding immediately after sub-regulation (3) the following new sub-regulation:

“(4) Unless the tenure of a hunting block has been renewed, hunting companies shall cease to operate and vacate the hunting block at the end of each hunting term.”

Amendment of
regulation 8

6. The principal Regulations are amended in regulation 8 by deleting sub-regulation (1) and substituting for it the following:

“(1) The Minister shall advertise vacant hunting blocks for auction and invite applications for bidding.”

Amendment of
regulation 9

7. The principal Regulations are amended in regulation 9(2) by-

- (a) deleting figure “300,000.00” appearing in the proviso to paragraph (a) and substituting for it figure “150,000.00”;
- (b) deleting figure “1,000,000.00” appearing in the proviso to paragraph (b) and substituting for it figure “500,000.00”.

Amendment of
regulation 12

8. The principal Regulations are amended in regulation 12 by-

- (a) adding the words “and issue a hunting block allocation certificate in the prescribed form set out in the Second Schedule to these Regulations” immediately after the word “applicant” appearing at

- the end of sub-regulation (3);
- (b) adding the word “Allocation” immediately after the word “Block” appearing in sub-regulation (4).

Addition of
regulation 12A

9. The principal regulations are amended by adding immediately after regulation 12 the following new regulation:

“Auction 12A.-(1) Notwithstanding the provisions of these Regulations, the Minister may allocate hunting blocks through auction, tender or any other competitive means he may deem appropriate.

(2) The provisions of regulations 7(2), 7(3), 8 and 16 shall not apply to hunting blocks obtained through auction, tender or any other competitive means.

(3) The Board may make guidelines for-

- (a) the conduct of auction, tender or other competitive means of allocation of hunting blocks;
- (b) the assessment of the performance of hunting companies allocated blocks through auction, tender or other competitive means.”

regulation 13

10. The principal Regulations are amended in regulation 13 by –

- (a) deleting the word “seasonal” appearing in sub-regulation (1) and substituting for it the word “annual”;
- (b) deleting sub-regulation (4) and substituting for it the following:

“(4) Notwithstanding sub-regulation (3), block fees for hunting blocks obtained through auction, tender or other competitive means shall be as determined during auction, tender or competitive means.”

- (c) adding the following sub-regulations immediately after sub-regulation (7):

“(8) The holder of a hunting block certificate shall, by 30th day of September, pay an amount of not less than USD 5000 annually to Tanzania Wildlife Management Authority as contribution to the implementation of various community development projects.

(9) The Board shall make guidelines for the distribution of the contribution stipulated under sub regulation (8).”

11. The principal Regulations are amended in regulation 14-
- (a) in sub-regulation (4), by deleting the reference to “sub-regulation (3)” and substituting for it the reference to “sub-regulation (1)”;
 - (b) in sub-regulation (5), by deleting the words “cause a hunting block allocation certificate to the transferee” and substituting for them the words “cause a hunting block allocation certificate to be issued to the transferee”.

regulation 15

12. The principal Regulations are amended by deleting regulation 15.

Amendment of
regulation 16

13. The principal Regulations are amended in regulation 16(4) by-
- (a) adding the word “Allocation” immediately after the word “Block” ;
 - (b) deleting the words “to the villages within and adjacent to his hunting block” appearing in paragraph (c).

Amendment of
regulation 19

14. The principal Regulations are amended in regulation 19-
- (a) in sub-regulation (1), by deleting the words “subject to sub regulation (2),” appearing in paragraph (a);
 - (b) by designating the contents of sub-regulation (2) as the closing phrase to sub-regulation (1);
 - (c) renumbering sub-regulations (3), (4), (5) and (6) as sub-regulations (2), (3), (4) and (5);
 - (d) deleting the reference to “sub-regulation (3)” appearing in the renumbered sub-regulation (3) and substituting for it the reference to “sub-regulation (2)”.

Amendment of
regulation 20

15. The principal Regulations are amended in regulation 20 by-
- (a) deleting the reference to “Sixth Schedule” in sub-regulation (5) and substituting for it the reference to “Fifth Schedule”;

- (b) adding immediately after sub-regulation (5) the following sub-regulation (6):

“(6) The Director may, upon application made before the expiry of the hunting permit, grant additional days which shall not exceed 30 days to the holder of a hunting permit.”

- (c) renumbering sub-regulations (6), (7), (8), (9), (10), (11) and (12) as (7), (8), (9), (10), (11), (12) and (13);
- (d) deleting the words “forty two days after the expiry of a hunting permit” appearing in the renumbered sub-regulation (13)(a) and substituting for them the words “fourteen days after the issuance of invoice”;
- (e) deleting the words “without prejudice to regulation 19(3)” appearing in the renumbered sub-regulation (13)(b).

regulation 22

16. The principal Regulations are amended in regulation 22(1) by deleting the words “forty two” and substituting for them the word “thirty”.

Amendment of
regulation 23

17. The principal Regulations are amended in regulation 23 by

- (a) deleting sub-regulation (7)(a) and substituting for it the following:
“ (a) Category A which shall allow the holder to supervise hunting of dangerous animals;”
- (b) deleting sub-regulation (8);
- (c) adding the following proviso immediately after sub-regulation (11):
“Provided that, where a professional hunter is exclusively supervising bird shooting safari, he may guide up to four clients.”

Amendment of
regulation 24

18. The principal Regulations are amended in regulation 24(2)(c) by deleting the words “trophies hunted” and substituting for them the words “animals hunted”.

Amendment of
regulation 26

19. The principal Regulations are amended in regulation 26 by deleting sub-regulations (2), (3), (4) and (5) and substituting for them the following:
“(2) Without prejudice to sub-regulation (1), a person shall not hunt-

(a) an elephant whose one of the tusks weighs less than 20 kgs or measures less than 160cm;

(a) a leopard whose length from the tip of the nose to the base of the tail is less than 130cm;

a crocodile whose length from the nose to the tip of the tail is less than 300 cm.

(3) Any professional hunter who guides a client to hunt in contravention of the provisions of this regulation commits an offence and shall upon conviction be liable to a fine of US Dollars four thousand.”

Amendment of
regulation 27

20. The principal Regulations are amended in regulation 27 by-

(a) deleting sub-regulations (1) and (2) and substituting for them the following:

“(1) Without prejudice to sub-regulation 26(1), no person shall hunt a lion of an age below six years and if such person hunts a lion below the age of six years shall be liable to a fine prescribed under sub-regulation (2), and the Director shall order the following:

(a) where the lion hunted is below the age of four years confiscate the hunted trophy;

(b) where a professional hunter supervises the hunting of a lion which is below the age of four years for the third time, suspend the professional hunter from supervising hunting of lions for three consecutive hunting seasons.

(2) Any professional hunter who guides a client to hunt a lion in contravention of sub-regulation (1) commits an offence and is liable on conviction-

(a) where the lion hunted is of the age of four or five years, to a fine of US Dollars two thousand five hundred and be allowed to export the hunted trophy;

(b) where the lion hunted is below the age of four years-

(i) to a fine of US Dollars two thousand five hundred for the first time of commission of an offence;

(ii) to a fine of US Dollars three thousand for the second time of commission of an offence; or

(iii) to a fine of US Dollars four thousand for the

third time of commission of an offence.”;

- (b) deleting the reference to “subregulation (8)” appearing in sub-regulation (4) and substituting for it the reference to “subregulation (3)”.

- (a) deleting the reference to “regulation 13(3)” appearing in the enabling provision and substituting for it the reference to “regulation 12(3)”;
