The Brucellosis Control (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 2014

Made - - - - - Coming into operation

24th October 2014 3rd November 2014

The Department of Agriculture and Rural Development(1) makes the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Articles 10(6), 19 and 60(1) of the Diseases of Animals (Northern Ireland) Order 1981(2).

#### **Citation and commencement**

**1.** This Order may be cited as the Brucellosis Control (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 2014 and shall come into operation on 3rd November 2014.

#### Amendment of the Brucellosis Control Order (Northern Ireland) 2004

2. The Brucellosis Control Order (Northern Ireland) 2004(3) shall be amended as follows—

- (a) In Article 5(1)(a) for the number "12" there shall be substituted the number "24".
- (b) In Articles 5 and 20 for each occurrence of the number "30" there shall be substituted the number "60".

The Department of Agriculture for Northern Ireland was renamed the Department of Agriculture and Rural Development by Article 3(4) of the Departments (NI) Order 1999 (S.I. 1999/283 (N.I.1))
