

Forest (Control of Timber) (Export of Unprocessed and Primarily Processed Indigenous Hardwoods) Regulations, 2001

It is hereby notified that the Minister of Environment and Tourism has, in terms of paragraph (a) of subsection (1) of section 65 of the Forest Act [Chapter 19:05], made the following regulations:—

1. These regulations may be cited as the Forest (Control of Timber) (Export of Unprocessed and Primarily Processed Indigenous Hardwoods) Regulations, 2001.

2. In these regulations “primarily processed”, in relation to indigenous hardwood, includes indigenous hardwood in the form of battens, baulks, blocks, planks, sheets, strips and mining and railway sleepers.

3. The export of the following species of indigenous hardwood is prohibited in unprocessed or primarily processed form—

- (a) Teak (*Baikiaea plurijuga*);
- (b) Mukwa (*Pterocarpus angolensis*);
- (c) Mchibi (*Guibourtia caleosperma*);
- (d) Pod Mahogany (*Azelia quazensis*);
- (e) Wooden banana (*Entandrophragma caudatum*);
- (f) Mopane (*Colophospermum mopane*);
- (g) Msasa (*Brachystegia speciformis*);
- (h) White syringa (*Kirkia acuminata*);
- (i) Munondo (*Julbernardia globiflora*);
- (j) Red Mahogany (*Khaya nyasica*);
- (k) Marula (*Sclerocarya birrea*);
- (l) Ebony (*Dalbergia melanoxylon*).
