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LAND SETTLEMENT AND DEVELOPMENT BOARD
(REPEAL)

An Act to repeal the Land Settlement and Development Board Act 1946, and to make provision in respect of the properties, rights and liabilities of the Board established by that Act.

1. This Act may be cited as the Land Settlement and Development Board (Repeal) Act. **Short title.**

2. In this Act— **Interpretation.**

"Board" means the Board established under the provisions of section 3 of the Land Settlement and Development Board Act, 1946; **7/1946.**

"Fund" means the Fund established under the provisions of section 11 of the Land Settlement and Development Board Act, 1946.

3. All lands which, immediately prior to the coming into force of this Act, were owned in fee simple by the Board shall be deemed, on such coming into force, to have been surrendered to and to have vested absolutely in the Crown. **Disposal of lands of the Board.**

4. All moveable property of the Board to which the Cabinet may direct that this section shall apply shall be deemed, on the coming into force of this Act, to have been transferred to, and to have become the property of, the Government. **Moveable property of Board.**

5. The benefit and burden of all leases and tenancy agreements in which the Board was tenant, immediately prior to the coming into force of this Act, shall be deemed, on such coming into force, to have been transferred from the Board to the Government. **Leases and tenancy agreements.**

Contracts.

6. The benefit and the burden of any contract made by the Board and in force immediately prior to the coming into force of this Act, being a contract to which the Cabinet may direct that this section shall apply, shall, on such coming into force, be deemed to have been transferred from the Board to the Government.

Liabilities.

7. The Cabinet may direct that any liability of the Board shall be deemed to have been transferred to, and become the liability of, the Government.

8. The Cabinet may by order make such provision as may appear to them expedient—

(a) for disposal of any sums remaining in the Fund at the commencement of this Act; and

(b) for securing the transfer to the Government of the undertaking, or any part thereof, of the Board and for matters consequential thereon.
