COMMUNICATION WITH VESSELS ACT

AN ACT to regulate communication with vessels arriving in this State. 1961 Ed.
Cap. 290.

Commencement.

1. This Act may be cited as the –

Short title.

COMMUNICATION WITH VESSELS ACT.

2. In this Act –

Interpretation.

“master” means the person in charge or in command of any vessel;

“vessel” means any vessel or boat of any description.

3. (1) It shall not be lawful for any person by means of any boat or otherwise to visit or go on board or to leave or disembark from any vessel arriving in the State, nor shall the master of any such vessel suffer or permit any boat or person to leave his vessel to visit the shore or any other vessel or boat until his vessel has been first visited and boarded by the visiting officer and leave given by the visiting officer to the master of the vessel to permit persons to leave or board his said vessel.

No persons to go on board or leave or disembark from any vessel without permission.

(2) Any person who contravenes this section is liable on summary conviction to a fine of five thousand dollars.

4. This Act shall in no way affect or prevent the boarding of any vessel by a licensed pilot acting in that capacity.

Licensed pilot may visit.

5. The Minister may from time to time make Rules and Regulations for carrying this Act into effect.

Rules.

6. Any person who contravenes any Rules or Regulations made under section 5 is liable on summary conviction to a fine of two hundred and fifty dollars.
