

List of Active Substances the Use of Which Is Prohibited in Plant Protection Products¹

Regulation No. 117 of the Minister of Agriculture of 7 July 2004

(RTL² 2004, 96, 1504),

entered into force 18 July 2004.

This Regulation is established on the basis of subsection 63 (4) of the Plant Protection Act (RT³ I 2004, 32, 226).

§ 1. Scope of application

The Regulation establishes the list of active substances the use of which is prohibited in plant protection products (hereinafter list).

§ 2. Active substances use of which is prohibited in plant protection products

(1) The list of active substances the use of which is prohibited in plant protection products is set out in the Annex.

(2) The Regulation does not apply to active substances which are intended for research or analysis or for conveyance from Estonia to a third country.

(3) The Plant Production Inspectorate may authorise the marketing and use of plant protection products which due to the nature of the production process contain additions of active substances set out in the list specified in subsection (1) in a quantity which does not pose a risk to humans, animals or the environment.

(4) In the event of unforeseeable danger which cannot be removed with other means, the Plant Production Inspectorate may authorise, as an exception, for a period of 120 days the marketing and use of plant protection products which contain additions of active substances set out in the list.

§ 3. Notification

The Plant Production Inspectorate shall inform other Member States and the European Commission of the grant of the exception specified in subsection (2) 4).

§ 6. Entry into force of Regulation

This Regulation enters into force on 15 July 2004.
