THE IMPORTATION OF MEAT AND MEAT PRODUCTS ORDER, 2001

Made	23 February 2001
Laid before the States	2001
Coming into force	23 February 2001

The States Agriculture and Countryside Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by Section 11 of the Animals and Animal Products (Import and Export) Ordinance, 1952, as amended (a), hereby orders:

1. The importation into the Island of the carcase of an animal from a Member State of the European Community, other than the United Kingdom, is permitted subject to the provisions of Section 2.
2. Any carcase imported under the provisions of Section 1 shall:
 - a) come from an animal that was slaughtered and processed at a slaughter house or meat plant approved under European Community legislation for the slaughter of animals for the export of meat; and
 - b) be accompanied by a health certificate, issued by a veterinary inspector appointed by the Competent Authority in the country of origin, that conforms with European Community legislation for intra-community trade in meat and meat products.
3. In this Order the following meanings shall apply:

“Animal” means cattle, sheep, goats and swine.,

“Carcase” means the carcase of any animal or any part thereof;

“Island” means the Islands of Guernsey, Herm and Jethou.

4. The Animals and Animal Products (Importation) Order, 1961 (c), the Animal Products Importation Order, 1971 (d) are hereby revoked.
5. The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948 (e) applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an enactment.
6. This Order may be cited as the Importation of Meat and Meat Products Order, 2001
7. This Order shall come into force on 23 February 2001.
