The Animals (Importation) (No.2) Order, 1979

Made 1st August 1979

Laid before the States

Coming into operation 15th August 1979

THE STATES COMMITTEE FOR AGRICULTURE, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by subsection (1) of section eleven of the Animals and Animal Products (Import and Export) Ordinance, 1952 as amended (a), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby orders:-

1. The importation into the Island of any horse, zebra, donkey and mule from the United Kingdom, the Republic of Ireland or the Isle of Man is hereby prohibited unless, in respect of each consignment thereof, there shall have been issued by the States Committee for Agriculture a licence in that behalf.

2. Such licence shall be subject to such conditions as the Committee may think it necessary to impose.

3. The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948 (b), shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an enactment.

4. The Animals (Importation) Order, 1979 (c), is hereby repealed.

5. This Order may be cited as the Animals (Importation) (No.2) Order, 1979.

6. This Order shall come into force on the fifteenth day of August nineteen hundred and seventy-nine.

Explanatory Note

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport).

The purpose of this Order is to repeal and re-enact the provisions of the Animals (Importation) Order, 1979, which prohibits the importation of horses, zebras, donkeys and mules into the Islands of Guernsey, Herm and Jethou from the United Kingdom, the Republic of Ireland and the Isle of Man except under licence and subject to such conditions as the Committee may impose.
