**The Animal Welfare
(Amendment of Schedule 2) Regulations, 2018**

THE COMMITTEE FOR THE ENVIRONMENT & INFRASTRUCTURE, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by sections 26(3) and 79 of the Animal Welfare (Guernsey) Ordinance, 2012^a, and all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations:-

Amendment of Schedule 2 to the Ordinance.

1. After paragraph 14 of Schedule 2 (activities requiring a licence) to the Ordinance, add the following paragraph -

"15. (1) The artificial insemination of a bovine animal or the transplantation of embryos from the uterus of a donor mother bovine animal to the uterus of any other recipient bovine animal.

(2) In this paragraph, "**embryos**" means the fertilised and developing ova of a bovine animal."

Interpretation.

2. (1) In these Regulations, "the Ordinance" means the Animal Welfare (Guernsey) Ordinance, 2012.

(2) The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948^b applies to the interpretation of these Regulations.

(3) Any reference in these Regulations to an enactment is a reference thereto as from time to time amended, re-enacted (with or without modification), extended or applied.

Citation and commencement.

3. These Regulations may be cited as the Animal Welfare (Amendment of Schedule 2) Regulations, 2018 and shall come into force on the 15th day of February, 2018.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations amend Schedule 2 to the Animal Welfare (Guernsey) Ordinance, 2012 to the effect that any person undertaking the artificial insemination of a cow or the transplantation of bovine embryos from a donor cow to a recipient cow will require a licence from the Committee for the Environment & Infrastructure.

These Regulations come into force on the 15th February, 2018.
