NOTE: Rule-making authority cited for formulation of Sanitary and Construction Permits by the Director of Public Health and Social Services, 10 GCA §20105.

The regulations for sanitary and construction permits are reprinted here in form as exact as possible to those filed on December 22, 1980 with the Legislative Secretary. The substance of the regulations has not been changed. However, for the purpose of uniformity and ease of use, a new system of numbering has been adopted by the Editor. It is hoped that the revised numerical system will eventually be substituted for that formulated by the Director of Public Health and Social Services.

§4501. Definitions. (a) *Sanitary Permit* means the official document issued by the Department of Public Health and Social Services authorizing the establishment to operate its business.

(b) *Construction Permit* means the official document issued by the Department of Public Health and Social Services authorizing the establishment to be constructed, reconstructed or altered.

(c) *Director* means the Director of Public Health and Social Services or his designated representative.

(d) *Eating and Drinking Establishment* - as defined in 10 GCA §22101.

(e) *Food Establishment* - as defined in 10 GCA §24101.

(f) *Institutional Facility* - as defined in 10 GCA §25102.

(g) *Hotel* - as defined in 10 GCA §26101.

(h) *Cosmetic Establishment* - as defined in 10 GCA §27101, including finger-pressure clinics.

(i) *Laundries and Dry Cleaning Establishments* - as defined in 10 GCA §28101.

(j) *Swimming Pool* - as defined in 10 GCA §29101.

(k) *Mortuary* - as defined in 10 GCA §30201.

(l) *Person* - as defined in 10 GCA §20101.

(m) *Exceptions* - as defined in 10 GCA §21101.

§4502. Fees. (a) All establishments which require Sanitary Permits, pursuant to 10 GCA §21101 shall be charged fees based on the average number of employees:

1 - 10 employees - \$ 60.00

11 - 99 employees - 60.00 (for the first 10 plus
2.00 per each additional
employee)

100 or more - 240.00

(b) Temporary food service establishment operating for less than six (6) months shall be charged Thirty Dollars (\$30.00). Non-profit organizations shall be charged Five Dollars (\$5.00).

(c) Duplicate permit fee shall be Five Dollars (\$5.00).

(d) All permits shall be valid for twelve (12) months and renewed on June 30 of each year:

(1) Permits shall be prorated to reflect an adequate charge to June 30.

(2) Non-profit organization permits are not subject to prorating.
