PROHIBITION OF IMPORTATION ORDER

*made under section 3 of the Plant Diseases and Pests
(Prevention) Ordinance 1935 continued in force by
section 19 of the Act*

1. This Order may be cited as the Prohibition of Importation Order. Citation.
2. Subject to such qualifications as may be specified, the importation into Guyana of the plants and materials described in the Schedule is hereby prohibited. Prohibition.

SCHEDULE

1. Citrus material (including fruit) from the United States of America. O. in C. 8/6/1937
2. (a) Raw coffee from all countries on the continent of South America. O. in C. 9/11/1937
(b) Raw coffee from all countries other than countries on the continent of South America:
Provided that the Chief Agricultural Officer may authorise importation of any particular consignment, if he is satisfied that it is the produce of a country in which the Coffee Berry-Borer, *Stephanoderes hampei* (Ferr.) is unknown.
3. Grape Fruit from Trinidad, and of all Citrus fruits from the remainder of the Commonwealth West Indian Islands. O. in C. 2/6/1938
4. Rice seed (padi) unless the written authorisation of the Chief Agricultural Officer is obtained. O. in C. 17/8/1938
5. Broom Corn from all countries other than Canada and the United States of America.
6. Broom Corn from Canada and the United States of America unless a fumigation certificate issued by an authority approved by the Chief Agricultural Officer is produced.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Plant Diseases and Pests (Notification) Regulations.

Declaration of notifiable disease or pests.

2. The Minister may, from time to time by order, declare any plant disease or pest to be a notifiable disease or pest.

2. The pests specified in the Schedule are hereby declared to be notifiable pests.

 PLANT DISEASES (BLAST) ORDER

O. 59/1958

made under section 4

1. This Order may be cited as the Plant Diseases (Blast) Order. Citation.
2. Owing to the presence of the disease known as Blast (*Piricularia Oryzae*) in the areas described in the Schedule the transport of padi, rice bran and rice straw from the areas aforesaid is hereby prohibited. Prohibition.

SCHEDULE

- (1) All lands situated on the East Bank of the Demerara River between Garden of Eden and Timehri Field.
- (2) All lands situated on the East Bank of the Berbice River between the northern boundary of Ma Retraite and the southern boundary of Mara.
