made under sections 4 and 17

1. This Order may be cited as the Plant Protection (Conditions of Exportation) Order. Citation.

2. Where a certificate of inspection of any plant to be exported from Guyana is required by the consignee, such plant shall be inspected by a Plant Protection Officer who shall, upon completing his inspection, if satisfied that such plant is substantially free from injurious diseases and pests and that the consignment conforms with the current phytosanitary regulations of the importing country, issue a certificate in the form in the Schedule. IMPORTATION OF FRUITS AND VEGETABLES REGULATIONS

made under section 16

Citation. 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Importation of Fruits and Vegetables Regulations.

Interpretation. 2. In these Regulations— "fruit" does not include nuts, or dried canned candied or other preserved fruits; "vegetable" does not include plantains, Irish potatoes, canned or preserved vegetables, or onions.

Importation of fruit and vegetable. 3. Except as otherwise provided in these Regulations, no fruit or vegetable shall be imported into Guyana unless there are produced

to the Comptroller of Customs—

(a) a certificate signed by the Chief Agricultural Officer showing that the fruit or vegetable, as the case may be, is not likely to cause infection inimical to the growth of plants; and

(b) a certificate signed by a competent authority, recognised by the Chief Agricultural Officer to be such, in the country of origin of the fruit or vegetable, showing that the fruit or vegetable, as the case may be, is free from pest or disease.

4. These Regulations shall not apply—

Application.

(a) to any fruit or vegetable which is imported from the British Islands, the Republic of Ireland, Canada, the United States of America or the Commonwealth territories of the West Indies (not including Bermuda and the Bahamas);

(b) to pineapples, citrus fruits, yams, sweet potatoes, or tannias which are imported from Surinam.
