

**PLANT PROTECTION (CONDITIONS OF IMPORTATION)
REGULATIONS**

made under section 16

Citation.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Plant Protection (Conditions of Importation) Regulations and shall come into operation on 1st April, 1955.

Importation
of planting
material.

2. (1) No planting material of the kinds or classes specified in the First Schedule shall be imported into Guyana unless a permit for such importation has previously been granted by the Chief Agricultural Officer.

(2) A separate permit shall be obtained for every consignment of planting material of the kinds or classes specified in the First Schedule.

(3) The importation of classes or kinds of planting material specified in the First Schedule shall be subject to the conditions prescribed in the permit.

Conditions to
be observed
for the
importation

3. (1) The following conditions shall be observed by persons contemplating importing any of the planting material specified in the First Schedule:

(a) a written application for a permit shall be made to the Chief Agricultural Officer. The application shall specify the quantity, kind and value of the planting material, the country and locality of origin, the name and address of the consignee and consignor and whether shipment will be made by freight, mail or air express;

(b) when a permit has been granted, the importer shall furnish the shipper with the number of the permit which must be marked on the container as required by paragraph 2.

(2) When the Planting material specified in the First Schedule is imported, each container shall bear the name and address of the consignor and consignee, and the number of the permit referred to in the last preceding paragraph.

(3) The consignee or his agent shall deliver the permit granted by the Chief Agricultural Officer to the Comptroller of Customs and Excise at the port of entry (or at the Post Office in the case of Packages arriving by mail) before delivery of the consignment can be obtained.

Prohibition.

4. The importation into Guyana of the plants and articles specified in the Second Schedule is hereby prohibited.

5. These Regulations shall not apply to the importation by the Chief Agricultural Officer for scientific purposes of any of the planting materials specified in the First Schedule or of any of the plants or articles specified in the Second Schedule. Application.

Banana
Plantain
Sugar-cane, including seeds.

SECOND SCHEDULE

reg. 4

Grasses of all plants other than sugar-cane
Earth
Soil, including leaf mould
Wrappings, cases, packages or other coverings which contain or have contained earth or soil
Any plant, article or material of any kind whatsoever packed with earth or soil.
