

MINAPOLITAN

(Regulation of the Maritime and Fisheries Minister No. PER.12/MEN/ 2010 dated May 14, 2010)

THE MARITIME AND FISHERIES MINISTER OF
THE REPUBLIC OF INDONESIA,

Considering :

- a. that to encourage the accelerated development of the maritime and fisheries sector, it is necessary to carry out the development of zone-based maritime and fisheries economy in an integrated, efficient and quality manner under the concept of minapolitan;
- b. that the development of maritime and fisheries economy under the concept of minapolitan needs the development of minapolitan zones to increase efficiency and optimize the comparative advantage and competitive edge of regions in accordance with the existing pre-production, production, manufacturing and/or marketing activities in an integrated, holistic and sustainable way;
- c. that based on the considerations in letters a and b, it is necessary to declare minapolitan under a Ministerial Regulation;

DECIDES :

To stipulate :

REGULATION OF THE MARITIME AND FISHERIES MINISTER ON MINAPOLITAN.

CHAPTER I

GENERAL PROVISIONS

Article 1

Referred to in this Ministerial Regulation as :

1. Region is a space which constitutes a geographical unit together with all relevant elements whose borders and system are decided based on administrative factors and/or functional aspects.
2. Minapolitan is a concept of zone-based maritime and fisheries economic development based on

the principles of integrity, efficiency, quality and acceleration.

3. Minapolitan zone is a part of region which has main economic function consisting of production, processing and/or marketing centers of fishery commodity, services and/or other supporting activities.
4. Production, processing and/or marketing center is a group of production, processing and/or marketing units with a variety of activities in a certain location.
5. Production, processing and/or marketing unit is a unit of businesses producing, processing and/or marketing a product or service.
6. Master plan is a plan to develop a minapolitan zone in a regency/municipality containing the policy and strategy of processing marine and fisheries potentials put in a concept of medium-term zone development policy within a period of 5 (five) years implemented through management plan and action plan.
7. Management plan is a plan to develop sectors and key products as an engine of economy in a minapolitan zone within a period of 5 (five) years according to the master plan.
8. Action plan is a plan to implement the development of minapolitan zone in a regency/municipality made on an annual basis by observing the phases of five-year development as contained in the master plan.
9. Minister is the Maritime and Fisheries Minister.

CHAPTER II

PRINCIPLES, AIM AND TARGET

Article 2

Minapolitan is realized based on the principles of:

- a. democratization of pro-people maritime and fisheries economy;
- b. government partiality to common people through empowerment of the community; and
- c. strong role of the regional economy under the principle of strong regions to create a strong nation and state.

Article 3

Minapolitan is realized with the aim of :

- a. raising production, productivity, and quality of maritime and fisheries products;
- b. improving the income of fishermen, fish farmers, and fish processors in a fair and evenly manner; and
- c. developing minapolitan zones as growth centers in regions.

Article 4

The target of minapolitan is among others to :

- 1. improve the economic capacity of maritime and fisheries society on a micro and small scale by, among others:
 - a. scrapping and/or reducing production cost, household spending, and illegal levies;
 - b. developing an efficient maritime and fisheries

production system for micro and small businesses;

- c. providing and distributing effective and cheap production means for the public;
 - d. providing technical and capital assistance; and/or
 - e. developing infrastructures to support the production, processing and/or marketing of maritime and fisheries products.
- 2. increase the number and quality of medium and large scale maritime and fisheries businesses so that they will have high competitiveness by, among others:
 - a. deregulating maritime and fisheries businesses;
 - b. providing security, business continuation and investment guarantees;
 - c. settling business and trade barriers (tariff and non-tariff barriers);
 - d. developing infrastructures to support production, processing and/or marketing systems; and
 - e. developing incentive and disincentive system for the export and import of maritime and fisheries products.
 - 3. turn the maritime and fisheries sector into the engine of regional and national economies by, among others :
 - a. developing a zone-based maritime and fisheries economic system;
 - b. developing maritime and fisheries economic

- zones in regions as local economic growth centers;
- c. revitalizing production, processing and/or marketing centers as the engine of the public economy; and
- d. empowering maritime and fisheries business groups in production, processing and/or marketing centers.

CHAPTER III

THE DEVELOPMENT OF MINAPOLITAN ZONES

Article 5

- (1) The development of minapolitan zones is done in an integrated, efficient, and quality manner to accelerate the improvement of production, processing and/or marketing systems.
- (2) The development of minapolitan zones is started from the development of production, processing and/or marketing units concentrated in production, processing and/or marketing centers in a zone projected or planned to become an integrat-edly-managed minapolitan zone.

Article 6

The characteristics of minapolitan zones cover:

- a. being an economic zone consisting of production, processing, and/or marketing centers and other business activities, such as services and trade;
- b. having facilities and infrastructures to support economic activities;

- c. accommodating and employing workers in and around the zones; and
- d. having a positive impact on the economy in near-by areas.

Article 7

A zone can be designated as a minapolitan zone if it meets the following requirements:

- a. it accords with the Strategic Plan, Spatial Lay-out Plan (RTRW) and/or Coastal Areas and Islets Management Zoning Plan (RZWP-3-K) of regen-cy/municipality, Regional Medium-Term Invest-ment Development Plan (RPIJMD) that has been in place;
- b. having key commodity in the maritime and fish-ery sector with high economic value;
- c. having strategic geographical location that nat-urally meets requirements to develop key com-modity in the maritime and fisheries sector;
- d. having production, processing and/or marketing units and business networks that actively pro-duce, process and/or market maritime and fish-eries products concentrated in a certain location and have interrelated production, processing and/or marketing chains;
- e. having supporting facilities in the form of access to the market, capital, production, processing and/or marketing facilities and infrastructures, and business institutes and counseling and train-ing facilities;
- f. environmental feasibility measured based on sup-

porting and accommodating capacity of the environment, potential negative impact, and potential destruction in the location in the future;

- g. regional commitment in the form of financing contribution, personnel, and minapolitan management and development facilities;
- h. the presence of regional government institute responsible for the maritime and fisheries sector; and
- i. the availability of data and information on the condition and potential of the zone.

Article 8

- (1) The selection of minapolitan zones is done in a coordinated way involving the government, provincial government and regency/municipal government according to the requirements as referred to in Article 7.
- (2) Based on the results of coordination and complete requirements as referred to in paragraph (1), the Minister shall decide a minapolitan zone.
- (3) In a minapolitan zone, the regent/mayor shall decide a minapolitan location according to his/her authority.
- (4) The decision on minapolitan location as referred to in paragraph (3) shall be submitted to the Minister within the framework of coordination and development.

Article 9

- (1) Based on the decision on minapolitan location as

referred to in Article 8 paragraph (3), the regent/mayor shall make a master plan implemented through a business plan and action plan.

- (2) The regency/municipal government shall make the master plan as referred to in paragraph (1) according to his/her authority in cooperation with the public, business world, institutes of higher learning, and other interested institutes.

Article 10

- (1) The master plan as referred to in Article 9 paragraph (1) shall be made by observing the Spatial Layout Plan and Regional Medium-Term Development Plan.
- (2) The master plan as referred to in paragraph (1) shall at least contain :
 - a. the results of a comprehensive study of all main aspects in the development of minapolitan zone as data base; and
 - b. projected direction, scenario, and phases of the medium-term development of minapolitan zone.
- (3) The results of a comprehensive study of all main aspects in the development of minapolitan zone as data base as referred to in paragraph (2) letter a shall identify :
 - a. the potential of minapolitan zone consisting of :
 - 1. the natural resources of the zone and its environs;
 - 2. the presence of production, processing

and/or marketing units in the zone;

- 3. human resources and institutions related to the development of the zone; and
- 4. facilities and infrastructures supporting the development of the zone.

- b. sectoral and regional development policies within the framework of synchronizing, integrating and harmonizing policies;
- c. structure and pattern of utilizing regional space within the framework of consistent application of RTRW and/or RZWP-3-K;
- d. obstacles and chances; and
- e. a chance of cooperation with interested parties.

(4) The projected direction, scenario, and phases of the medium-term development of minapolitan zone as referred to in paragraph (2) letter b shall contain at least:

- a. strategy, direction of policies, and phases of the development of the minapolitan zone within a period of 5 (five) years, divided into the attainment of annual quantitative and qualitative targets;
- b. each of the 5 (five)-year quantitative and qualitative targets, accompanied by a successful indicator and yardstick of the development of key sectors and products in a more focused way, and the development of all main aspects in the minapolitan zone;
- c. strategy, direction of polices, and phases of the development of the minapolitan zone re-

lated to the effort to encourage the development of nearby areas.

(5) The business plan as referred to in Article 9 paragraph (1) shall contain at least :

- a. projected upstream and downstream development of key sectors and products;
- b. market information and access;
- c. capital access;
- d. technological access; and
- e. infrastructures and facilities supporting transportation and distribution.

(6) The action plan as referred to in Article 9 paragraph (1) shall contain at least :

- a. matrix of programs and activities;
- b. location;
- c. timetable;
- d. agency/executing unit;
- e. projected fund needs;
- f. funding sources;
- g. output;
- h. outcome; and
- i. performance indicator.

Article 11

(1) The development of minapolitan zone shall be done by:

- a. conducting national campaigns;
- b. encouraging production, processing and/or marketing in key production centers which are pro-small businesses;
- c. integrating production, processing and/or

marketing centers into a key economic zone and later into a minapolitan zone;

- d. guiding businesses and providing technical assistance in key production, processing and/or marketing centers in the form of counseling, training and technical assistance; and
 - e. developing a zone-based maritime and fisheries economic system.
- (2) The development of minapolitan zone as referred to in paragraph (1) shall be done by the Government, Provincial Governments, and Regency/Municipal Governments according to their authority.

CHAPTER IV

MONITORING, EVALUATION AND REPORTING

Article 12

- (1) Regents/Mayors shall monitor and evaluate the development of minapolitan zones in their jurisdiction.
- (2) The results of monitoring and evaluation as referred to in paragraph (1) shall be submitted to relevant Governors at least twice a year, with a copies addressed to the Minister, Minister/Head of Non-Ministerial Government Institute concerned.

Article 13

Governors shall monitor and evaluate the development of minapolitan zones in their regions and submit reports to the Minister, Minister/Head of Non-Ministerial Government Institute concerned.

Article 14

- (1) The Minister, along with the Minister/Head of Non-Ministerial Government Institute concerned shall monitor and evaluate the development of minapolitan zones.
- (2) The results of monitoring and evaluation serve as materials for government officers to nurture and control the development of minapolitan zones according to their respective authority.

CHAPTER V

NURTURING

Article 15

- (1) The Minister in cooperation with the Ministers/ Heads of Non-Ministerial Institutes concerned shall nurture the development of minapolitan zones by :
 - a. giving guidance;
 - b. providing facilities to carry out activities related to coordination, synchronization, consultation and synergy of policies and programs/activities among sectors and among business agents.
- (2) Governors shall nurture the development of minapolitan zones by coordinating, harmonizing and integrating activities among regencies/municipalities to develop minapolitan zones.

CHAPTER VI

FINANCING

GOVERNMENT REGULATIONS

Article 16

All expenses arising from the development and nurturing of minapolitan zones shall be borne by the State Budget and/or Regional Budget as well as by other legal and unbiding sources according to the law and regulation.

CHAPTER VII

CONCLUSION

Article 17

This Ministerial Regulation shall come into

force as from the date of stipulation.
