PRESIDENTIAL REGULATION OF THE REPUBLIC OF INDONESIA

NUMBER 111 OF 2022

ON

ACHIEVING SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS

WITH THE BLESSINGS OF THE ONE AND ONLY GOD

THE PRESIDENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF INDONESIA,

- Considering :
- a. that the State of Indonesia is a member of the United Nations with an active role in establishing Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) set out in *Transforming Our World: The 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development*;
 - b. that said SDGs are to be achieved by way of establishing national Sustainable Development Goals, developed in reference to the global 2030 SDGs, and goals of current national medium-term development plans;
 - c. that under the Decade of Action, the implementation of the Sustainable Development Goals is in its 10 years, requiring acceleration of the achievement thereof by all stakeholders at the national and subnational levels;
 - d. that under the above considerations in points a, b, and c, a Presidential Regulation is to be established on Achieving Sustainable Development Goals;
- In view of :
1. Article 4, paragraph (1) of the 1945 Constitution of the Republic of Indonesia

2. Law no. 17 of 2007 on 2005–2025 National Long-Term Development Plan (State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia number 104 of 2004, supplement to the State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia number 4421);
3. Law no. 25 of 2004 on the System of National Development Planning (State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia number 33 of 2007, supplement to the State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia number 4700);
4. Law No. 23 of 2014 on Sub-national government (State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia No. 244 of 2014, Supplement to State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia No. 5587) as most recently amended by Law No. 9 of 2015 on The Second Amendment to Law No. 23 of 2014 on Sub-national government (State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia No. 58 of 2015, Supplement to State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia No. 5679);
5. Government Regulation no. 33 of 2018 on the Performance of the Duties and Authorities of Governors as Representative of the National Government (State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia number 109 of 2018, supplement to the State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia number 6224);
6. Government Regulation no. 18 of 2020 on the 2020–2024 National Medium-Term Development Plan (State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia number 10 of 2020);

HAS DECIDED:

To establish : PRESIDENTIAL REGULATION OF THE REPUBLIC OF INDONESIA ON ACHIEVING SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS.

Article 1

In this Presidential Regulation, the following definitions shall apply:

- (1) Sustainable Development Goals, hereinafter SDGs, is global development agenda to end poverty, improve prosperity, and protecting the planet through the achievement of 17 (seventeen) goals by 2030.
- (2) National SDG Road Map is a planning document setting out the strategic phased policies towards the achievement of SDGs from 2017 to 2030 in line with the global 2030 SDGs and with national development goals.
- (3) National SDG action plan is a document setting out programmes and activities under ministerial/ institutional and stakeholder's SDG work plans in line with current national medium-term development plans and set out in reference to the national SDGs.
- (4) Subnational SDG action plan is a document setting out programmes and activities under provincial and district government SDG work plans in line with current national medium-term development plans and set out in reference to the national SDGs.
- (5) National Government is the President of the Republic of Indonesia invested with authorities of the government of the Republic of Indonesia, assisted by the Vice President and ministers as established in the 1945 Constitution of the Republic of Indonesia.
- (6) Subnational Government is the head of subnational regions as an element in the administration of regional government to lead the implementation of government affairs as authorised under regional autonomy.
- (7) Governor representing National Government is an administrator of government affairs over which the Subnational Government is given authority in its respective subnational government.

- (8) Community-based organisation, hereinafter CBO, is an organisation developed and formed by the community without coercion based on common aspiration, will, needs, interest, activities, and purpose to participate in the achievement of the goals of the Unitary State of the Republic of Indonesia based on the Five Principles (Pancasila) and the 1945 Constitution of the Republic of Indonesia.
- (9) Academics is professional educators and scientists whose primary tasks it is to transform, develop, and disseminate science, technology, arts through education, research, and community service.
- (10) Philanthropy is any individual or institution that as public service willingly shares support and resources with others with the purpose of addressing the challenges in sustainable development.
- (11) Enterprise is any individual or entity engaged in business and/or activity in specific fields.
- (12) Innovative funding is a global-, national-, or subnational-level non-government stakeholder serving as a source or providing a scheme of funding to accelerate the achievement of SDGs.
- (13) Minister is a minister administering government affairs in national development planning.

Article 2

- (1) Under this Presidential Regulation, the 2024 National SDGs are established in reference to the 2030 global SDGs and the goals of the 2020–2024 national medium-term development plan as set out in the Annex, which shall constitute an inseparable part hereof.
- (2) The national SDGs as referred to in paragraph (1) are:
 - a. sustainably maintain the growth of economic welfare of the public;

- b. maintain the sustainability of the social life of the public;
- c. maintain environmental quality and inclusive development; and
- d. establish governance allowing for inter-generational improvement of life.

Article 3

The 2024 national SDGs as referred to in Article 2, paragraph (1) serve as:

- (1) a guideline for:
 - a. ministries/institutions in developing, implementing, monitoring, and evaluating the national SDG action plan together with the ministry administering government affairs in development planning; and
 - b. Subnational Governments in developing, implementing, monitoring, and evaluating the subnational SDG action plan together with the ministry administering government affairs in development planning and with the ministry administering government affairs in interior government matters; and
- (2) a guideline for CBOs, philanthropies, enterprises, academics, and other stakeholders to plan, implement, monitor, and evaluate SDGs.

Article 4

- (1) In the context of achieving the 2024 national SDGs as referred to in Article 2, paragraph (1), the Minister shall:
 - a. develop and determine updating to the 2017–2030 SDG Road Map; and

- b. coordinate the development and establishment of the 2024 national SDG action plan.
- (2) Ministers/Heads of institutions shall plan, implement, monitor, and evaluate the progress towards SDG achievement in accordance with their respective duties, functions, and authorities.
- (3) In support of the achievement of SDGs, relevant ministries/institutions shall provide and update data.

Article 5

- (1) Governors representing the National Government shall develop and establish a subnational SDG action plan with regents/mayors within their respective area of service, engaging CBOs, philanthropies, enterprises, academics, and other stakeholders. Governors representing the National Government.
- (2) Governors representing the National Government shall facilitate, supervise, and synchronise the development of subnational SDG action plans as referred to in paragraph (1) in coordination with the Minister and the minister administering interior government affairs.
- (3) Further provisions on the mechanisms of coordination of the development, monitoring, evaluation, and reporting of subnational SDG action plans shall be provided under a Ministerial Regulation.

Article 6

For the purposes of achieving SDGs, the Minister shall coordinate:

- (1) the facilitation and mentoring of subnational SDG action plans;
- (2) the monitoring, evaluation, and reporting of national and subnational SDG achievements; and

- (3) the planning of government sources of funding and other lawful and non-binding sources.

Article 7

Further provisions on the procedures of coordination, planning, monitoring, evaluation, and reporting of SDG implementation shall be provided in a Ministerial Regulation.

Article 8

In the context of the achievements of the 2024 national SDGs, a coordination team shall be appointed comprising:

- a. a national steering committee;
- b. a national implementation team;
- c. a national working group; and
- d. an expert panel.

Article 9

- (1) Such steering committee shall serve to provide direction in the achievement of SDGs in Indonesia.
- (2) Such steering committee as referred to in paragraph (1) shall be composed of:

Deputy Chair	Vice President;
Deputy Chair I	Coordinating Minister for Economic Affairs
Deputy Chair II	Coordinating Minister for Human Development and Cultural Affairs;
Deputy Chair III	Coordinating Minister for Maritime and Investment Affairs;
Deputy Chair IV	Coordinating Minister for Political, Legal, and Security Affairs;

Implementation Coordinator cum Member	Minister for National Planning/Head of the National Development Planning Agency;
Members	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Minister of Foreign Affairs; 2. Minister of Home Affairs; 3. Minister of Finance; 4. Minister of State-Owned Enterprises; 5. Cabinet Secretary; and 6. Head of the Presidential Staff.

Article 10

- (1) Such national implementation team shall serve to implement the direction provided by the national steering committee by developing and recommending policies and coordinating the inclusive achievement of SDGs.
- (2) Such national implementation team as referred to in paragraph (1) shall be led and chaired by a *pimpinan tinggi madya* (equivalent to echelon 1) official in the ministry of national development planning/national development planning agency, with members including elements of ministries/institutions, philanthropies, enterprises, academics, and CBOs.

Article 11

In performing their duties as set out in Article 10, paragraph (1), such national implementation committee shall be assisted by a national working group of which members include elements of ministries/institutions, philanthropies, enterprises, academics, and CBOs.

Article 12

- (1) An expert panel shall provide SDG-substantive considerations to the national implementation team to ensure the achievement of SDGs in Indonesia.
- (2) Such expert panel shall have as its members experts and/or professionals in fields related to the achievement of SDGs.

Article 13

In performing their duties, the national implementation team shall be assisted by a national secretariat led by a *pimpinan tinggi madya* (equivalent to echelon 1) official in ‘the ministry of national development planning/national development planning agency.

Article 14

Further provisions on the duties, procedures, and composition of such national implementation team, national working group, expert panel, and national secretariat shall be provided in a Ministerial Regulation.

Article 15

- (1) Ministers/Heads of institutions shall report the achievement of national 2024 SDG implementation to the Minister each year.
- (2) Governors representing the National Government shall report the achievement of the subnational SDG action plan to the minister administering interior government affairs and to the Minister each year.
- (3) The Minister shall serve as the coordinator and a member of the national coordination team and shall report the national and subnational achievements of the 2024 national SDGs to the President 1 (one) time a year and as required.

Article 16

- (1) The output of the 2024 national SDG implementation as referred to in Article 15, paragraph (3) shall constitute the content of the Indonesian yearly SDG achievement report at the regional and global levels.
- (2) The output of SDG implementation by ministries/ institutions and Subnational Governments under Presidential Regulation no. 59 of 2017 on the Achievement of Sustainable Development Goals shall constitute the content of the SDG achievement report.

Article 17

- (1) The national 2024 SDGs may be reviewed according to the evaluation and recommendations of the national steering committee based on input from the national implementation team and/or considerations of the expert panel.
- (2) Such review as referred to in paragraph (1) shall be coordinated by the Minister with relevant ministers/ heads of institution.

Article 18

- (1) SDG funding shall be sourced from:
 - a. the state revenue and expenditure budget;
 - b. subnational revenue and expenditure budgets; and/or
 - c. other lawful and non-binding sources in accordance with provisions of laws and regulations.
- (2) Such other lawful and non-binding sources as referred to in paragraph (1), point c may constitute Innovative Funding.

- (3) Further provisions on Innovative Funding as referred to in paragraph (2) shall be provided in a Ministerial Regulation based on considerations of the minister administering government affairs in financial matters.

Article 19

- (1) SDG funding may be sourced from a combination of Innovative Funding sources and state and/or subnational revenue and expenditure budgets.
- (2) Further provisions on such SDG funding sourced from a combination of Innovative Funding sources and state and/or subnational revenue and expenditure budgets as referred to in paragraph (1) shall be provided in a Ministerial Regulation by the minister administering government affairs in financial matters.

Article 20

The implementation provisions hereunder shall be made effective within 1 (one) year since the promulgation of this Presidential Regulation.

Article 21

This Presidential Regulation shall come into effect since the date of its promulgation.

For public cognizance, the promulgation hereof shall be placed in the State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia.
