**THE ENDANGERED SPECIES (PROTECTION, CONSERVATION  
AND REGULATION OF TRADE) ACT**

**THE ENDANGERED SPECIES (PROTECTION, CONSERVATION AND REGULATION OF TRADE)  
(AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS, 2002**

In exercise of the power conferred upon the Minister by section 53 of the Endangered Species (Protection, Conservation and Regulation of Trade) Act, and of every other power hereunto enabling, the following Regulations are hereby made:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Endangered Species (Protection, Conservation and Regulation of Trade) (Amendment) Regulations, 2002 and shall be read and construed as one with the Endangered Species (Protection, Conservation and Regulation of Trade) Regulations, 2000 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Regulations).

2. Regulation 1 (2) of the principal Regulations is amended—

- (a) by deleting the words “not apply to a species” and substitute therefor the words “apply to any species”; and

(b) by inserting immediately after paragraph (2) the following—

“(3) The forms set out in the Second Schedule apply in the case of all species, whether or not such species are under quotas determined pursuant to section 15 (1) (f) of the Act.”.

3. Regulation 4 of the principal Regulations is amended by deleting paragraphs (a) and (b) and substituting therefor the following—

“(a) \$500.00 in respect of an import permit;

(b) \$ 1000.00 in respect of —

(i) an export permit;

(ii) a re-export certificate; and

(iii) a certificate for artificial propagation and breeding in captivity.”.

4. Regulation 9 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by inserting next after the words “Second Schedule”, wherever they appear, the word “hereto”.

5. Regulation 13 of the principal Regulations is amended—

(a) by re-numbering the regulation as paragraph (1) thereof; and

(b) by inserting immediately after paragraph (1), as re-numbered, the following—

“(2) Where a permit or certificate is issued to an applicant but will expire before it reaches its final destination, the applicant shall, at least fourteen days before the expiry of that permit or certificate, apply for another permit or certificate to cover the period upon and following its arrival.”.

6. Regulation 17 (1) of the principal Regulations is repealed and the following substituted therefor—

“17. —(1) Permits or certificates referred to in regulations 2, 3, 6, 8 and 9 shall be issued on payment of the following fees—

7. Artificial Propagation Export Certificate—

(1A) An applicant for an export or import permit or re-export certificate may apply for a maximum of seventeen specimens on each permit or certificate; and where the applicant wishes or intends to import, export or re-export more than seventeen such specimens, he shall submit an additional application for specimens in excess of those seventeen specimens.”.

6. The principal Regulations are amended by inserting next after regulation 17 the following as regulation 18—

“18. Where the Management Authority incurs costs including—

- (a) travelling to and inspection of the applicant’s facility;
- (b) the identification, by an expert, of specimens and the use thereof;
- (c) the use of identification tags or micro-chips; or
- (d) such other reasonable costs as the Management Authority may have incurred in the processing and issuing of permits, the applicant shall reimburse the Authority for such costs incurred.”.

7. The First Schedule to the principal Regulations is amended in Forms 1 and 2 by inserting in the top right-hand corner of each form immediately after the words “ ☐ RE-EXPORT Certificate” and “ ☐ RE-EXPORT CERTIFICATE”, respectively, the following—

“☐ OTHER CERTIFICATES” and  
“☐ OTHER CERTIFICATES”.
