1. These Rules may be cited as the Kingston and St. Andrew Corporation (Shop Licences) Rules, 1965.

2. In these Rules—

“inspector” means the person appointed by the Council for the purposes of section 151 of the Act;

“meat” includes fresh meat, poultry, and game;

“vegetables” include ground provision and fresh fruit.

3.—(1) Every application for a licence to establish in the Corporate Area a shop for the sale of meat, fresh fish or vegetables shall be in the form set out in the First Schedule, and addressed to the Council at its offices in Kingston.

(2) Upon receipt of an application for a licence as aforesaid, the Council shall cause the premises to which such application refers to be inspected and a report of the findings of such inspection shall be attached to the application.

(3) The Council shall consider every application and shall inform the applicant whether or not the licence has been granted, within fourteen days of such decision.

4.—(1) Every licence granted by the Council pursuant to an application as aforesaid shall be in the form set out in the Second Schedule, and shall remain in force for a period of one year from the date on which it was issued, unless sooner revoked or surrendered, and may be renewed from time to time by the Council.

(2) For the purpose of this rule, the date on which a licence is issued shall be the date on which the fees in respect of such licence are first paid.

5. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary, where the Council is satisfied that a shop is adequately equipped with refrigeration facilities, they may grant a licence limited to the sale, in such shop, of eviscerated poultry packed in unbroken sealed packages.

6. There shall be payable in respect of every licence granted by the Council the fees specified in the second column of the Third Schedule in relation to the class of licence specified in the first column of that Schedule :

Provided that such fees may be paid in four equal instalments payable at intervals of three months, the first such instalment to be paid on the date on which the licence is issued.

7.—(1) A licence may be revoked by the Council if—

- (a) the fees or any instalment thereof remain unpaid for seven days after the same become due and payable;
- (b) the licensee has sold or permitted to be sold within the shop to which the licence relates any articles other than those authorized by such licence and for which a licence is required under these Rules;
- (c) the licensee has been convicted for any offence against the provisions of the Act relating to markets and slaughter-houses or against the provisions of the Public Health Law relating to the handling of food, or against any regulations made under any of the abovementioned provisions, for the time being in force; or
- (d) the inspector reports to the Council that the licensee has failed to comply within fourteen days with any written instructions given under the provisions of rule 8.

(2) A licence may be surrendered by the licensee if he ceases to carry on the business for which the licence was granted.

(3) Where any licensee has paid fees for a full year on a licence and such licence is either surrendered or revoked in accordance with the provisions of this rule, the Council shall refund to the licensee that portion of the fees which would not have become due and payable up to the date of such surrender or revocation, as the case may be, had such fees been paid in instalments; and where the fees on such licence as aforesaid have been paid in instalments, the licensee shall not be liable to pay any instalments which would have become due after that date.

(4) Every licence revoked by the Council or surrendered by the licensee shall be cancelled.

8. An inspector may from time to time by notice in writing, give to a licensee such instructions as he may deem necessary to ensure that the shop is kept in a satisfactory condition for the purpose of any of the enactments or regulations mentioned in rule 7 (1) (c) and the licensee shall comply with such instructions within fourteen days of the date on which the notice is served.
