ROYAL COURT (POSSESSION ORDERS) (JERSEY) LAW 1998

A LAW to empower the Royal Court to make orders for possession of certain immovables.

1 Possession Orders

- (1) Notwithstanding the provisions of the Loi (1946) concernant l'expulsion des locataires réfractaires,¹ (the "Law of 1946"), where the Royal Court –
 - (a) is exercising its jurisdiction in proceedings for the cancellation (*résolution*) of a contract of lease of an immovable; and
 - (b) orders the cancellation of that lease,it shall have the power to make an order for possession of the immovable.
- (2) The power in paragraph (1) may be exercised to grant –
 - (a) immediate possession of the immovable; or
 - (b) possession at a later date of the immovable,in accordance with Article 3(3) and (3A) of the Law of 1946 as if the provisions of that Law applied to the Royal Court.
