CUSTOMARY LAW AMENDMENT (No. 2) (JERSEY) LAW 1984

A LAW to abolish any rule of customary law providing for the annulment of contracts for the transfer of immovable property on the death of the transferor within 40 days of the passing of the contract

Commencement [[see endnotes](#)]

1 Contract of deceased person

Any rule of customary law, that a contract passed before the Royal Court for the transfer of immovable property may be annulled, at the instance of the heirs or devisees, as the case may be, of the transferor, if he or she dies within 40 days of the passing of the contract, is abolished.

2 Citation, saving

- (1) This Law may be cited as the Customary Law Amendment (No. 2) (Jersey) Law 1984.
- (2) Nothing in this Law shall be held to prejudice any right of action arising before the coming into force of this Law.
