

## **REGULATIONS ON BOUNDARY VETERINARY CONTROL POINTS OF KR**

### **I. General Regulations**

- 1.1. Boundary Veterinary Control Points (BVCP) of the management body of state veterinary KR are created in accordance with the Article 4 of the Law KR "On veterinary" of March 6, 1992 in entry points through the state border KR by the MAF KR.
- 1.2. BVCP in its activity follows the Law KR "On veterinary", other laws KR, Resolutions of the Government KR, Orders, Instructions, Decisions of MAF KR, the Republic management body of state veterinary, Recommendations, Instructions and Rules on issues of veterinary and by the current Regulation.
- 1.3. BVCP is the structural subdivision of the Republic management body on state veterinary and is financed at the expense of the state budget. An estimation of expenses and staff of the BVCP are to be approved by the Republic management body on state veterinary.
- 1.4. BVCP has its own stamp with its name, register and submit the information to the Republic management body on state veterinary.
- 1.5. Instructions of BVCP on issues of protection from bringing of the pathogenic agents of animals disease from foreign countries and observation of veterinary and sanitation rules during the transportation through the state boundary of loads under state veterinary supervision are obligatory for the implementation by the officials and owners of the loads. (The list of loads under the state veterinary supervision is attached).

### **2. The main tasks.**

- 2.1. The protection of the territory of KR from the bringing of pathogenic diseases of animals, prohibition of entry and removal of loads under the state veterinary supervision which do not correspond to the veterinary and sanitary requirements.

### **3. The Responsibilities.**

- 3.1. To organise veterinary examination of animals imported to and exported from the KR.
- 3.2. To control the veterinary and sanitary state of imported and exported loads under state veterinary supervision as well as transport which is transporting them.
- 3.3. To implement the state veterinary supervision after the implementation by officials and owners of loads (commodities) under the state veterinary supervision of veterinary requirements of countries- importers, veterinary legislation of KR, international, intergovernmental agreements (Conventions) on issues of veterinary.
- 3.4. To check the presented loads (commodities) for the state veterinary supervision with veterinary documents, correspondence of quality and quantity to the documents.

- 3.5. To issue a veterinary certificate for exported loads (commodities) under the state veterinary supervision in exchange for veterinary reference, and for imported - veterinary references on receiving of certificate.
- 3.6. To give the permission for import and export of loads (commodities) under state veterinary supervision upon their correspondence with veterinary and sanitary requirements of countries- importer and countries-exporter.
- 3.7. To study the epizootic state in the zone of BVCP dislocation.
- 3.8. To inform the Republic and rayon (in accordance with the location of BVCP) management body of state veterinary about every case of discovery of sick or suspected in infection of imported or exported animals.
- 3.9. To take measures on eradication of infectious diseases imported and exported animals and prevention of their spreading as well as isolation, of unfavourable in terms of veterinary and sanitation, animals, products and raw materials of livestock origin, fodder.
- 3.10. To organise and to hold in necessary cases the treatment of transport in the established order.
- 3.11. To take necessary veterinary and sanitation measures in cases of transition of the boundary of KR of animals without supervision.

#### **4. The employees of BVCP have the right :**

- 4.1. To demand the presentation of veterinary certificates or certificates for importing and exporting loads (commodities) under state veterinary supervision and the implementation of instructions, recommendations, other normative-legislative acts, international and interstate agreements on veterinary issues by the owners of the loads.
- 4.2. To prohibit the importation and export of loads under the state veterinary supervision for the owners if they do not have veterinary documents and disparity to veterinary and sanitary requirements.
- 4.3. To suspend, isolate and disinfect unfavourable in terms of veterinary and sanitation the loads under state veterinary supervision, which can bring pathogenic agents of infectious disease of animals into the territory of KR.
- 4.4. To take all necessary measures on prevention of emerge and spreading of infectious disease if there is a threat of brining them into the territory of KR from contengiose countries; to demand from owners and officials the holding of veterinary and sanitation treatment of loads and transport.
- 4.5. To impose the fines on officials and owners of loads under the state veterinary supervision in accordance with the Article 14 of the Law KR "On veterinary" of March 6, 1992 in case of violation of veterinary and sanitation requirements upon export and import transportation of loads, quarantine conditions and decisions of power bodies on issues of fight against the infectious diseases of animals.
- 4.6. To submit proposals on temporary closing of the state border of KR with the states, on the territory of which infectious disease emerged and there is a threat of brining their pathogenic agents into the KR.

#### **5. The leadership and organisation of the activity.**

- 5.1. BVCP is headed by the Head, which is veterinary surgeon by the speciality.

- 5.2. The Head of BVCP is to be appointed and released by the order of Republic department body of state veterinary.
- 5.3. An appointment and release of BVCP employees is to be done by the order of the Republic management body on state veterinary upon the presentation of the Head of BVCP.
- 5.4. Job responsibilities of employees and rules of internal schedule of BVCP are to be designed by the head of BVCP and are to be approved by the Head of the Republic management body on state veterinary.

#### **6. The responsibility.**

- 6.1. The employees of BVCP are to bear the administrative and legal responsibility after the implementation of their duties, production activity, safe keeping and usage of the transferred input supply and production-and-labour discipline.

#### **7. The Reorganisation and Liquidation.**

- 7.1. The reorganisation and liquidation of BVCP take the place in case of closing of entry point through the State boundary of the KR by the order of MAF KR upon the presentation by the Republic management body on state veterinary.

**The List of loads (commodities) under state veterinary supervision during the transportation through the state border KR.**

1. Domestic and wild animals and poultry.
2. Sea animals, reptiles, Crustacean and other hydrobionts.
3. Exotic. Decorative, zoopark and laboratory animals, poultry, fish and other amphibia.
4. Bees and other useful insects.
5. Alive caviar, breed eggs, sperm of producers and embryo.
6. Products of animal origin:  
meat of domestic and wild animals, poultry, fish and caviar;  
animal fat and grease;  
raw fish and fish products, smoked products;  
subproducts;  
eggs and egg mixture;  
milk and milk products;  
honey and other products of apiculture;
7. Raw material of livestock origin:  
not processed leather and fur raw material ;  
wool, down, hair, bristle;  
poultry feather and down;  
not processed bones, horns, hoofs;  
flesh side and cuttings;  
dry, wet and salt intestine  
blood of animals dry and tinned;  
endocrine glands;  
meat -and- bone meal.
8. Raw materials for biological industry, culture and conserving medium, biopreparations, toxin-poison, alive cultures of mushrooms, bacterium, virus pathogenic agents of infectious disease of animals.
9. Forage - grain products, oil-seed meal, mixed fodder, forage, as well as packaging means of plant origin ( hay, straw).
