

**SOLID WASTE AND PUBLIC CLEANSING MANAGEMENT (MANNER OF
APPEAL) REGULATIONS 2011**

IN exercise of the powers conferred by sections 13 and 29 of the **Solid Waste and Public Cleansing Management Act 2007**[Act 672], the Minister makes the following regulations:

1. Citation and commencement

(1) These regulations may be cited as the **Solid Waste and Public Cleansing Management (Manner of Appeal) Regulations 2011**.

(2) These Regulations come into operation on 1 September 2011.

2. Manner of appeal

(1) A person who is aggrieved by the decision of the Director General made under Parts III and IV of the Act may appeal to the Minister within fourteen days from the date the decision is communicated to such person by serving a notice of appeal on the Minister.

(2) A notice of appeal under subregulation (1) shall-

(a) be made in writing in the national language and may be accompanied by a translation in the English language;

(b) state the grounds of the appeal stating the substance of the decision of the Director General appealed against;

(c) contain an address at which any notices or documents connected with the appeal may be served upon the appellant; and

(d) be signed by the appellant.

(3) The appellant shall also serve a copy of the notice of appeal on the Director General.

3. Grounds of decision

Upon receipt of a copy of the notice of appeal served under subregulation 2(3), the Director General shall submit a statement of the grounds of his decision to the Minister within fourteen days from the date of receipt of the copy of the notice of appeal.

4. Decision of Minister on appeal

(1) The Minister shall, after considering-

(a) the grounds of appeal stated by the appellant under paragraph 2(2)(b); and

(b) the statement of the grounds of decision submitted by the Director General under regulation 3, decide on the appeal.

(2) The decision of the Minister on the appeal shall be communicated to the appellant by the Director General through a written notice within seven days from the date the Director General is notified of such decision.

(3) The decision of the Minister on the appeal shall be final and binding.
