

CHAPTER 276.

MANUFACTURE OF PRESERVES.

(20th April, 1897.)

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Manufacture of Preserves Ordinance.

Short title.

2. Upon the exportation from the Colony of any preserves, that is to say, jam or preserved fruits, made or prepared therein, there shall be paid to the exporter such sum as shall be proved to the satisfaction of the Treasurer to have been paid into the Treasury of the Colony as duty of customs in respect of any sugar used in the Colony in the manufacture or preparation of the preserves so exported.
