REGULATION FOR THE IMPORTATION OF HATCHING EGGS, POULTRY /
BIRDS INTO MYANMAR

A Animal : Poultry / Birds

B Importing Country : All Countries

C Purpose : Breeding

D. Regulation for importation

1. Import Licence

The consignment of animals shall be accompanied by a valid import licence issued by Government authority of Myanmar.

2. Description of Animal

The consignment of animals shall be accompanied by a certificate containing a full description or identification of the animals.

3. Veterinary Certification

- 3.1 An international health certificate signed by authorized veterinary officer of exporting country. This certificate should mention the detail description of imported animal
- 3.2 Pedigree certificate shall accompany the imported egg or poultry for breeding purpose on arrival.
- 3.3 The hatching egg or DOC must originate from an officially accredited farm .
- 3.4 The country of origin is free from Fowl plague, *S. pullorum* and highly pathogenic Avian Influenza.
- 3.5 During the (6) months immediately prior to export, the premises of origin must be free from clinical signs or other evidence of Avian Encephalomyelitis, Egg-drop Syndrome (EDS), Haibo Virus Infection, Infectious Anaemia and Ornithosis.
- 3.6 The hatching eggs or day old poultry shall come from a hatchery of which the management, hygiene and disease security procedures have been approved by an authorized veterinary office according to OIE International Animal Health Code.

- 3.7 The hatching egg or day old poultry shall be packed directly from the incubator to new unused boxes for export and shall have no contact with any eggs, poultry of other birds not similarly held in status.
- 3.8 The day old poultry are subjected to quarantine at approved premises for a period of at least 14-30 days upon arrival during which they shall be submitted to test and or treatments if necessary.
- 3.9 The import or owner shall be fully charged for the incurred expenses. In the case of wild birds, which have been kept on continuous supervision and inspected within (30) days preceding the date of export.
- 3.10 Failure to follow the import procedures may result in returning the poultry/ DOC to the country of origin or destroying without compensation.

4. Fee

The following fees are payable, for each consignment of hatching egg, poultry and bird imported into Myanmar.

For hatching egg

- (1) Quarantine fee : 1 kyats per egg
 (2) Health Certificate : 1 kyats per egg

For DOC

- (1) Quarantine fee : 2 kyats per head
 (2) Health Certificate : 2 kyats per head
