
Under and by virtue of the powers conferred by Section 14 of The Saw Mills Act, Chapter 344 of The Revised Statutes of Newfoundland, 1970, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, the Honourable the Minister of Forestry and Agriculture has made the following Regulations which were approved by His Honour the Administrator in Council on the 6th. day of March, 1975.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as The Saw Mills Regulations, 1975.
2. In these regulations
 - "Act" means The Saw Mills Act;
 - "licence" means a licence to operate a mill issued or renewed under the Act;
 - "Minister" means the Minister of Forestry and Agriculture.
3. An applicant for the issue or renewal of a licence shall pay a fee of twenty dollars for each licence or renewal thereof to be issued to him.
4. A licence shall state:
 - (a) the location of the mill;
 - (b) the amount of timber which may be sawn under the licence.
5. A licence shall not be transferred or assigned to any other person without the prior written consent of the Minister.
6. The licensee shall within thirty days after the date of expiry of the licence furnish a return on the form prescribed by the Minister showing:
 - (a) the quantity, size and type of lumber produced;
 - (b) the manner in which the lumber was used or otherwise disposed of; and
 - (c) the quantity, size and type of lumber held on inventory.
7. No licence shall be renewed unless a return has been made to the Department on the form prescribed by the Minister.
8. The licensee shall utilize all timber and avoid the unnecessary waste of timber in his sawing or manufacturing operations.
9. The licensee shall pile his sawdust, slabs and other waste material from his mill at a distance of not less than 1,000 feet from any lake, pond, brook or stream or any body of salt water and shall prevent the entrance of any such waste into these waters.
10. No mill shall be operated during the fire season unless it is accessible by a road passable to trucks or similar vehicles.
11. The licensee shall exercise strict and constant supervision over his operations to prevent the origin and spread of forest fires and he shall comply with all laws and regulations made in respect thereof.
12. Mill operations carried out under a licence may be suspended by the Minister or any person authorized by the Minister in any area where in his opinion such operations constitute a fire hazard.
13. The Saw Mills Regulations, 1959, are revoked.
