Notice

1 Title

This notice is the Fisheries (Notification of Tāngata Tiaki/Kaitiaki for Mātaitai Reserves at Kaihoka Point and Anatori) Notice 2017.

2 Commencement

This notice comes into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

3 Revocation of this notice

This notice is revoked at the end of 5 April 2019.

4 Mātaitai reserves

This notice applies to the mātaitai reserves at Kaihoka Point and Anatori, on the upper West Coast of the South Island, that was declared by the Fisheries (Declaration and Notification of Kaihoka and Anatori Mātaitai Reserve and Appointment of Tangata Tiaki/Kaitiaki) Notice 2010 (*Gazette* 2010, p 4254).

5 Appointment cancelled

- (1) The Minister of Fisheries has cancelled the appointment of Barney Thomas as a Tangata Tiaki/Kaitiaki for the mātaaitai reserves.
- (2) The cancellation took effect at the end of 5 April 2014.

6 New appointment

- (1) The Minister of Fisheries has appointed Rima Piggott as a Tangata Tiaki/Kaitiaki for the mātaaitai reserves.
- (2) The appointment—
 - (a) took effect on 6 April 2014; and
 - (b) expires at the end of 5 April 2019.

Explanatory note

This note is not part of the notice, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This notice is made under regulation 23 of the Fisheries (South Island Customary Fishing) Regulations 1999 (the **regulations**). The notice comes into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette* and revokes itself at the end of 5 April 2019.

This notice relates to the mātaaitai reserves at Kaihoka Point and Anatori, which are on the upper West Coast of the South Island. The tangata whenua of the area that includes the mātaaitai reserves are represented by Te Rūnanga o Ngāti Rārua.

Notice is given of—

- the cancellation of the appointment of a Tangata Tiaki/Kaitiaki for the mātaaitai reserves; and
- the replacement appointment of a Tangata Tiaki/Kaitiaki for the mātaaitai reserves.

The Minister of Fisheries cancelled the appointment and made the replacement appointment at the request of Te Rūnanga o Ngāti Rārua.

The powers of Tāngata Tiaki/Kaitiaki are set out in the regulations.
