

PLANT VARIETY RIGHTS AMENDMENT REGULATIONS 1999

PURSUANT to section 38 of the Plant Variety Rights Act 1987, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, makes the following regulations.

New First Schedule of Principal Regulations

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement---(1) These regulations may be cited as the Plant Variety Rights Amendment Regulations 1999, and are part of the Plant Variety Rights Regulations 1988

2: S.R. 1993/146

Amendment 1997: S.R. 1997/67

(`the principal regulations").

(2) These regulations come into force on 1 July 1999.

2. Quantities of seed to be provided with applications---Regulation 5 of the principal regulations is amended by revoking subclause (1), and substituting the following subclause:

`(1) An application for a variety of a kind described in column 1 of the First Schedule of these regulations must be accompanied by---

`(a) The quantity of seed specified (opposite the description) in column 2 of the Schedule, together with the quantity, if any,

of seed in ears specified (opposite the description) in column 5 of the Schedule; or

- “(b) If no quantity is specified in column 2 of the Schedule,---
 “(i) The quantity, if any, of nucleus seed specified (opposite the description) in column 3 of the Schedule; and
 “(ii) The quantity, if any, of seed of a generation of plants either grown from nucleus seed or descended from plants grown from nucleus seed specified (opposite the description) in column 4 of the Schedule.”

3. New First Schedule substituted---The principal regulations are amended by revoking the First Schedule, and substituting the schedule set out in the Schedule of these regulations.

4. Consequential revocations---The following regulations are revoked:

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 1 July 1999,---

- (a) Modify the quantities of seed required to be supplied with applications for grants of plant variety rights in respect of plants of certain varieties; and
- (b) Add a requirement that applicants supply as well 100 ears of seed with applications for varieties of barley, oats, and wheat.
