Designation of Parks

1. (1) The parks named in Column 1 of the Table are the provincial parks of Ontario. R.R.O. 1990, Reg. 951, s. 1 (1).

(2) A provincial park consists of the land delimited or set aside for it, as described in the Schedule referred to in Column 2 of the Table or as described in section 2 of this Regulation. R.R.O. 1990, Reg. 951, s. 1 (2); O. Reg. 136/91, s. 1.

2. A provincial park named in this section consists of the following land:

AARON PROVINCIAL PARK

In the geographic Township of Zealand, in the Territorial District of Kenora, containing 116.74 hectares, more or less, being composed of those parts of the said geographic township, designated as Parts 1, 2, 3 and 4 on a plan known as Aaron Provincial Park, filed on November 6, 1998 with the Office of the Surveyor General of Ontario in the Ministry of Natural Resources.

ABITIBI-DE-TROYES PROVINCIAL PARK (HISTORICAL CLASS)

In the geographic Township of Kerrs and in unsurveyed territory in the Territorial District of Cochrane, containing 4,340 hectares, more or less, being composed of that part of the said geographic township and unsurveyed territory designated as Part 1, on a plan known as P1616 Abitibi-De-Troyes Provincial Park (Historical Class), filed on March 14, 2005, with the Office of the Surveyor General of Ontario in the Ministry of Natural Resources.

AGASSIZ PEATLANDS PROVINCIAL PARK (NATURE RESERVE CLASS)

In the geographic Townships of Pratt and Spohn, and in the geographic Township of Blue, now in the municipal Township of Dawson, in the Territorial District of Rainy River, containing 5,415 hectares, more or less, being composed of those parts of the said geographic Townships designated as Parts 1 to 3, both inclusive, on a plan known as Agassiz Peatlands Provincial Park (Nature Reserve Class), filed on February 24, 2003 with the Office of the Surveyor General of Ontario in the Ministry of Natural Resources.

ALEXANDER LAKE FOREST PROVINCIAL PARK (NATURAL ENVIRONMENT CLASS)

In the geographic Township of Antoine, in the Territorial District of Nipissing, containing 1,934 hectares, more or less, being composed of that part of the said geographic township designated as Part 1 on a plan known as P123 Alexander Lake Forest Provincial Park (Natural Environment Class), filed on February 14, 2003 with the Office of the Surveyor General of Ontario in the Ministry of Natural Resources.

ALEXANDER STEWART PROVINCIAL PARK (NATURE RESERVE CLASS)

In the geographic Township of McNab, in the municipal Township of McNab/Braeside, in the County of Renfrew, containing 30 hectares, more or less, being composed of that part of the said geographic township designated as Part 1 on a plan known as P45 Alexander Stewart Provincial Park (Nature Reserve Class), filed on April 22, 2003 with the Office of the Surveyor General of Ontario in the Ministry of Natural Resources.

ALGOMA HEADWATERS PROVINCIAL PARK (NATURAL ENVIRONMENT CLASS)

In the geographic Townships of Gapp, Gaudry, Hoffman, Handleman, Way-White, Wlasy, Bracci, Ewen, Ferrier and Butcher, in the Territorial District of Algoma, and in the geographic Townships of Schembri, Sherratt, Carton, Carruthers, Neill, Patenaude and Beckett, in the Territorial District of Sudbury, containing 42,736 hectares, more or less, being composed of those parts of the said geographic townships designated as Parts 1 to 7, both inclusive, on a plan known as P273 Algoma Headwaters Provincial Park (Natural Environment Class), filed on February 24, 2003 with the Office of the Surveyor General of Ontario in the Ministry of Natural Resources.

ALGONQUIN PROVINCIAL PARK

In the Territorial District of Nipissing and in the County of Haliburton containing 772,300 hectares, more or less, described as follows:

Beginning at the northeasterly corner of the geographic Township of Fitzgerald;

Thence southerly along the easterly boundary of that township to the northwesterly corner of the geographic Township of Edgar;

Thence easterly along the northerly boundary of that township to the northeasterly corner thereof;

Thence southerly along the easterly boundary of that township to the northwesterly corner of the geographic Township of Bronson;

Thence easterly along the northerly boundary of that township to the northeasterly corner thereof;

Thence southerly along the easterly boundary of the geographic townships of Bronson, Stratton and Master to the southeasterly corner of the last mentioned township;

Thence westerly along the southerly boundary of the geographic townships of Master, Guthrie and Clancy to the intersection with the southerly production of the westerly limit of Lot 23, Concession I, in the geographic Township of Clancy;

Thence northerly along that production and the westerly limit of that Lot 23 to the northwesterly corner thereof;

Thence easterly along the northerly limit of that Lot 23 to the southwesterly corner of Lot 22, Concession II;

Thence northerly along the westerly limit of that Lot 22 to the northwesterly corner thereof;

Thence northerly in a straight line across the allowance for road between concessions II and III to the southwesterly corner of Lot 22, Concession III;

Thence northerly along the westerly limit of that Lot 22 to the northwesterly corner thereof;

Thence westerly along the northerly limit of lots 23, 24 and 25, Concession III, to the northwesterly corner of Lot 25, Concession III;

Thence westerly in a straight line across the allowance for road between lots 25 and 26 to the northeasterly corner of Lot 26, Concession III;

Thence westerly along the northerly limit of lots 26, 27, 28, 29 and 30, Concession III, to the northwesterly corner of Lot 30, Concession III;

Thence westerly in a straight line across the allowance for road between lots 30 and 31 to the northeasterly corner of Lot 31, Concession III;

Thence westerly along the northerly limit of lots 31, 32, 33 and 34, Concession III and the prolongation of that limit across bodies of water to the northeasterly corner of Lot 35, Concession III;

Thence southerly along the easterly limit of that Lot 35 to the southeasterly corner thereof;

Thence westerly along the southerly limit of that Lot 35 to the southwesterly corner thereof;

Thence southerly in a straight line across the allowance for road between concessions II and III to the northeasterly corner of Lot 36, Concession II;

Thence southerly along the easterly limit of that lot 814.730 metres;

Thence westerly and parallel to the northerly limit of lots 36 and 37, Concession II to the westerly limit of that Lot 37;

Thence continuing westerly parallel to the northerly limit of that Lot 37 to the westerly boundary of the geographic Township of Clancy;

Thence northerly along the westerly boundary of that township to the northerly boundary of the geographic Township of Murchison;

Thence westerly along that northerly boundary to the northwesterly corner of the geographic Township of Murchison;

Thence westerly along the southerly boundary of the geographic Township of Preston 7,660.517 metres;

Thence south 14°53'00" west 212.232 metres;

Thence south 14°55'10" west 943.399 metres;

Thence south 13°40'00" west 97.265 metres;

Thence south 14°28'00" west 84.350 metres;

Thence south 15°40'00" west 655.344 metres;

Thence northerly along the aforesaid prolongation and the centre line of the allowance for road adjacent to Lot 1, concessions I to XIII, both inclusive, as shown on the plan of the Township of Bruton, and its prolongation across bodies of water to the intersection with the centre line of the allowance for road in front of Concession I, as shown on the plan of the Township of Clyde;

Thence northerly along the centre line of the allowance for road adjacent to Lot 1, concessions I to IV, both inclusive, as shown on the plan of the Township of Clyde, to the intersection with the production easterly of the southerly limit of Lot 34, Concession IV, as shown on the plan of the Township of Eyre;

Thence westerly along that production to the southeasterly corner of that Lot 34, Concession IV;

Thence westerly along the southerly limit of lots 34, 33, 32 and 31, Concession IV, to the southwesterly corner of Lot 31, Concession IV;

Thence westerly in a straight line across the allowance for road between lots 30 and 31 to the southeasterly corner of Lot 30, Concession IV;

Thence westerly along the southerly limit of lots 30, 29, 28, 27 and 26, Concession IV, to the southwesterly corner of Lot 26, Concession IV;

Thence westerly in a straight line across the allowance for road between lots 25 and 26 to the southeasterly corner of Lot 25, Concession IV;

Thence westerly along the southerly limit of lots 25, 24, 23, 22 and 21, Concession IV, to the southwesterly corner of Lot 21, Concession IV;

Thence northerly along the westerly limit of that Lot 21 to the northwesterly corner thereof;

Thence northerly in a straight line across the allowance for road between concessions IV and V to the southwesterly corner of Lot 21, Concession V;

Thence northerly along the westerly limit of Lot 21, concessions V and VI, to the northwesterly corner of Lot 21, Concession VI;

Thence northerly in a straight line across the allowance for road between concessions VI and VII to the southwesterly corner of Lot 21, Concession VII;

Thence northerly along the westerly limit of Lot 21, concessions VII and VIII, to the northwesterly corner of Lot 21, Concession VIII;

Thence northerly in a straight line across the allowance for road between concessions VIII and IX to the southwesterly corner of Lot 21, Concession IX;

Thence northerly along the westerly limit of Lot 21, concessions IX and X, and its prolongation across Rainbow Lake to the northwesterly corner of Lot 21, Concession X;

Thence northerly in a straight line across the allowance for road between concessions X and XI to the southwesterly corner of Lot 21, Concession XI;

Thence northerly along the westerly limit of Lot 21, concessions XI and XII, to the northwesterly corner of Lot 21, Concession XII;

Thence northerly in a straight line across the allowance for road between concessions XII and XIII to the southwesterly corner of Lot 21, Concession XIII;

Thence northerly along the westerly limit of Lot 21, concessions XIII and XIV and the northerly production of that westerly limit across the allowance for road in front of concession XIV to the southerly boundary of the Township of Sherborne, McClintock, Livingstone, Lawrence and Nightingale;

Thence westerly along that southerly boundary to the centre line of the allowance for road adjacent Lot 35, Concession I, as shown on the plan of the Township of Livingstone;

Thence northerly along the centre line of the allowance for road adjacent to Lot 35, concessions I to X, both inclusive, to the centre line of the allowance for road between concessions X and XI as shown on that plan;

Thence south $69^{\circ}03'$ west along that centre line 754.758 metres;

Thence south $68^{\circ}50'05''$ west along that centre line 803.672 metres;

Thence north $20^{\circ}50'50''$ west 10.058 metres to the southeasterly corner of Lot 31, Concession XI, as shown on the plan of the Township of Livingstone;

Thence continuing north $20^{\circ}50'50''$ west along the easterly limit of said Lot 31 and its production northerly, 1,861.679 metres;

Thence south $69^{\circ}09'10''$ west 2,144.414 metres;

Thence north $20^{\circ}50'50''$ west 2,122.344 metres to the southerly boundary of the geographic Township of Peck;

AMABLE DU FOND RIVER PROVINCIAL PARK (WATERWAY CLASS)

In the geographic Township of Calvin, in the municipal Township of Calvin, and in the geographic Townships of Boulter and Lauder, in the Territorial District of Nipissing, containing 731 hectares, more or less, being composed of those parts of the said geographic townships designated as Parts 1 to 13, both inclusive, on a plan known as P128 Amable Du Fond River Provincial Park (Waterway Class), filed on February 14, 2003 with the Office of the Surveyor General of Ontario in the Ministry of Natural Resources.

ARROWHEAD PROVINCIAL PARK

In the geographic Township of Chaffey, now in the Town of Huntsville, in The District Municipality of Muskoka containing 1237.0 hectares, more or less, being composed of that part of the said geographic Township of Chaffey designated as Part 1 on a plan known as Arrowhead Provincial Park, approved on the 18th day of December, 1987 and filed in the Office of the Surveyor General of Ontario in the Ministry of Natural Resources at Toronto, Ontario.

ARROW LAKE PROVINCIAL PARK

In the Territorial District of Thunder Bay, containing 386.0 hectares, more or less, being composed of that part of the said territorial district, designated as Part 1 on a plan known as Arrow Lake Provincial Park, filed on January 29, 1999 with the Office of the Surveyor General of Ontario in the Ministry of Natural Resources.

AUBINADONG-NUSHATOGAINI RIVERS PROVINCIAL PARK (WATERWAY CLASS)

In the geographic Townships of Ewen, Ferrier, Havrot, Handleman, McIlveen and Reilly, in the Territorial District of Algoma, containing 4,928 hectares, more or less, being composed of that part of the said geographic townships designated as Part 1 on a plan known as P277 Aubinadong-Nushatogaini Rivers Provincial Park (Waterway Class), filed on February 14, 2003 with the Office of the Surveyor General of Ontario in the Ministry of Natural Resources.

AUBINADONG RIVER PROVINCIAL PARK (WATERWAY CLASS)

In the geographic Townships of Foulds, Jessiman, Maeck, McNie, Renwick and Timbrell in the Territorial District of Algoma, and in the geographic Township of Cassidy in the Territorial District of Sudbury, containing 2,722 hectares, more or less, being composed of those parts of the said geographic townships designated as Parts 1 to 5, both inclusive, on a Plan known as P319 Aubinadong River Provincial Park (Waterway Class), filed on January 14, 2002 with the Office of the Surveyor General of Ontario in the Ministry of Natural Resources.

AWENDA PROVINCIAL PARK

In the Township of Tiny, in the County of Simcoe, containing 2,915 hectares, more or less, being composed of those parts of the said Township of Tiny designated as parts 1 and 2 on a plan known as Awenda Provincial Park, filed on August 28, 1995 in the Office of the Surveyor General of Ontario at the Ministry of Natural Resources at Toronto, Ontario.

BARRON RIVER PROVINCIAL PARK (WATERWAY CLASS)

In the geographic Township of Petawawa, in the Town of Petawawa, and in the geographic Township of McKay, in the Town of Laurentian Hills, in the County of Renfrew, containing 539 hectares, more or less, being composed of that part of the said geographic townships designated as Part 1 on a plan known as P58 Barron River Provincial Park (Waterway Class) filed on December 29, 2005, with the Office of the Surveyor General of Ontario in the Ministry of Natural Resources.

BASS LAKE PROVINCIAL PARK

In the geographic and municipal Township of Orillia in the County of Simcoe, containing 65.0 hectares, more or less, being composed of that part of the east and west halves of Lot 5, Concession 1 (Southern Division), Township of Orillia designated as Part 1 on a plan known as Bass Lake Provincial Park, approved on the 23rd day of August, 1992 and filed in the Office of the Surveyor General of Ontario in the Ministry of Natural Resources at Toronto, Ontario.

BATCHAWANA RIVER PROVINCIAL PARK (WATERWAY CLASS)

In the geographic Townships of Runnalls, Norberg, Wishart and Palmer, in the Territorial District of Algoma, containing 2,684 hectares, more or less, being composed of those parts of the said geographic townships designated as Parts 1 and 2 on a Plan known as P282 Batchawana River Provincial Park (Waterway Class) filed on February 25, 2004 with the Office of the Surveyor General of Ontario in the Ministry of Natural Resources.

BEATTIE PINERY PROVINCIAL PARK (NATURE RESERVE CLASS)

In the geographic Township of Tecumseth, now in the Town of New Tecumseth, County of Simcoe, containing 68.08 hectares, more or less, being composed of that part of the said geographic township designated as Part 1 on a plan known as Beattie Pinery Provincial Park (Nature Reserve Class), filed on February 4, 2004 with the Office of the Surveyor General of Ontario in the Ministry of Natural Resources.

BIG EAST RIVER PROVINCIAL PARK (WATERWAY CLASS)

In the geographic Township of Chaffey, in the Town of Huntsville, and in the geographic townships of Sinclair and Finlayson, in the municipal Township of Lake of Bays, in The District Municipality of Muskoka, containing 1,050 hectares, more or less, being composed of those parts of the said geographic townships designated as Parts 1 to 4, both inclusive, on a plan known as P83 Big East River Provincial Park, filed on May 2, 2000 in the Office of the Surveyor General at the Ministry of Natural Resources at Peterborough, Ontario.

BIGWIND LAKE PROVINCIAL PARK

In the geographic Township of Oakley, now in the Town of Bracebridge, in the District Municipality of Muskoka, containing 1,967 hectares, more or less, being composed of those parts of the said geographic Township of Oakley designated as Parts 1, 2, 3 and 4 on a plan known as Bigwind Lake Provincial Park, approved on August 29, 1994 and filed in the Office of the Surveyor General of Ontario at the Ministry of Natural Resources at Toronto, Ontario.

BISCOTASI LAKE PROVINCIAL PARK (NATURAL ENVIRONMENT CLASS)

In the geographic Townships of Smuts, Hollinger, Biscotasi, Arden and Lillie, in the Territorial District of Sudbury, containing 12,283 hectares, more or less, being composed of those parts of the said geographic townships designated as Parts 1 and 2 on a plan known as Biscotasi Lake Provincial Park (Natural Environment Class), filed on May 14, 2001, with the Office of the Surveyor General of Ontario in the Ministry of Natural Resources.

BISSETT CREEK PROVINCIAL PARK (WATERWAY CLASS)

In the geographic Townships of Clara and Maria, in the municipal Township of Head, Clara and Maria, in the County of Renfrew, containing 1,676 hectares, more or less, being composed of that part of the said geographic townships designated as Part 1 on a plan known as P125 Bissett Creek Provincial Park (Waterway Class) filed on December 29, 2005, with the Office of the Surveyor General of Ontario in the Ministry of Natural Resources.

BLACK STURGEON RIVER PROVINCIAL PARK (WATERWAY CLASS)

In the geographic Townships of Adamson, Lyon, Church, Hele, McMaster, Cockeram and Graydon, and in the geographic Township of Nipigon, in the municipal Townships of Red Rock and Nipigon, and unsurveyed territory, in the Territorial District of Thunder Bay, containing 23,531 hectares, more or less, being composed of those parts of the said geographic townships and unsurveyed territory designated as Parts 1, 2 and 3 on a plan known as Black Sturgeon River Provincial Park (Waterway Class), filed on May 5, 2003 with the Office of the Surveyor General of Ontario in the Ministry of Natural Resources.

BLIND RIVER PROVINCIAL PARK (WATERWAY CLASS)

In the geographic Township of Beange, now in the City of Elliot Lake, and in the geographic Townships of Kamichisitit, Jogues and Juliette, now in the Town of Blind River, and in the geographic Townships of Albanel, Nicholas and Montgomery, in the Territorial District of Algoma, containing 5,402 hectares, more or less, being composed of that part of the said geographic townships designated

as Part 1 on a Plan known as P265 Blind River Provincial Park (Waterway Class), filed on January 17, 2002 with the Office of the Surveyor General of Ontario in the Ministry of Natural Resources.

BLUE JAY CREEK PROVINCIAL PARK
