PROTECTED PLACES ORDER 2002

ARRANGEMENT OF PARAGRAPHS

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 5(1) of the Protected Areas and Protected Places Act, the Minister for Home Affairs hereby makes the following Order:

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Protected Places Order 2002 and shall come into operation on 6th February 2002.

Premises declared to be protected place

2. The premises described in the second column of the Schedule are hereby declared to be a protected place for the purposes of the Act, and no person shall be in those premises unless he is in possession of a pass-card or permit issued by the authority specified in the first column of the Schedule or has received the permission of an authorised officer on duty at the premises to enter the premises.

All that area comprised in part of State Land Lots 1-2, 3-2, 3-4, 339, 516, 517, 99919W, State Land Lots 669, 670, State Reserve Lot 668, part of State Reserve Lots 515, 1347C, 1334M in MUKIM No. 9 (CHOA CHU KANG), part of State Land Lot 3681V, part of State Reserve Lot 3553X in MUKIM No. 10 (JURONG) occupied by "ARMY LOGISTICS BASE" containing an area of about 97,190 square metres and bounded approximately as follows:


