**SASKATCHEWAN REGULATION 279/80**  
under *The Heritage Property Act – Section 79*

TITLE AND INTERPRETATION

**Title**

- 1** These regulations may be cited as The Heritage Property Regulations.

**Interpretation**

- 2** In these regulations, “**Act**” means *The Heritage Property Act*.

**Definitions re Act**

- 3** For the purposes of the Act:

- (a) “**boulder effigy**” means all sites which contain or contained lines, clusters, configurations or patterns of stones, rocks, cobbles or other lithic objects which depict zoomorphic, anthropomorphic, or geometric figures or other representations;
- (b) “**burial object**” means all archaeological objects which are, or have been, found in association with a burial place;
- (c) “**burial place**” or “**burial mound**” means all sites which contain or upon inspection can be reasonably expected to contain or have contained human skeletal material or burial objects;
- (d) “**human skeletal material**” means all osseous parts or elements of the human anatomy
- (e) “**medicine wheel**” means all sites which contain or did contain lines, clusters, configurations and circular or semi-circular patterns of stones, rocks, cobbles or other lithic objects;
- (f) “**petroglyph**” means any picture, design, symbol, art work or other representation pecked, carved or incised on a natural rock surface at least 75 years before the present;
- (g) “**pictograph**” means any picture, design, symbol, art work or other representation painted on a natural rock surface at least 75 years before the present.

**Request for review**

5 The request for a review shall state the affected property, the person requesting the review and the reasons for the request.

**Receipt of request**

6 The secretary of the review board shall notify the applicant in writing upon receipt of the request and inform him of the location of the public meeting.

**Counsel or agent**

7 Any person appearing before the review board may be represented by counsel or an agent.

**Decision**

8 Every decision of the review board shall state the date it is issued.

**Adjournment**

9(1) Upon the request of a party to a hearing and the designating authority, the review board may adjourn any matter before it and, in that case, the board shall not prepare a decision and shall so notify all parties participating in the hearing and any other person who requests such notice.

(2) The chairman of the review board may adjourn a meeting of the review board at his discretion.

## CANCELLATION OF PERMIT

**Cancellation of permit**

**10(1)** For the purposes of subsection 68(8) of the Act, the permit holder, in a request for the cancellation of his permit, shall:

- (a) provide, in writing, an explanation of the reason for the request;
- (b) furnish, in writing, a description of the activities completed in accordance with that permit;
- (c) describe all measures required to:
  - (i) complete the activities proposed in the application for that permit; and
  - (ii) if applicable, return, insofar as it is possible, the site to its original state; and
- (d) provide reasonable assurance that the work described in clause (c ) has been completed.

**(2)** At the time that a request is made for the cancellation of a permit, the permit holder shall:

- (a) furnish the curatorial repository identified in that permit with copies of or, if required by the minister, originals of all records, maps, forms and photographs amassed; and
- (b) yield to that repository all objects recovered and acquired in the course of the permitted work.
