

# **Regulation No.76 of the Slovak Environmental Committee**

## **dated 5<sup>th</sup> February, 1992 on waste management programs**

Pursuant to Article 10, Section 8 of the No. 494/1991 (Collection of Laws) law of the Slovak National Council on state administration in the field of waste management, the Slovak Environmental Committee has established the following:

### ***Article 1***

This Regulation refers to contentual and methodological details in the preparation and issuance of waste management programs (hereinafter referred to as “programs”) by country and district environmental authorities<sup>1)</sup> and by producers of waste<sup>2)</sup> (hereinafter referred “producers”).

### ***Article 2***

1. County and district environmental authorities participate in the preparation and creation of the program of the Slovak Republic. They elaborate the necessary documentation within their respective jurisdictions for the purpose.
2. County and district environmental authorities shall issue their respective programs within two months from issuance of the program of the Slovak Republic.<sup>3)</sup>
3. Should at a time following to issuance of the program the facts which had been of decisive importance for its contents undergo essential changes, the county and district environmental authorities shall update their respective programs. Cases where changes in the contents or objectives of the environmental committee or its superior or subordinate body might occur by such updating shall be discussed in advance with these bodies by the updating authority.

### ***Article 3***

1. Programs of county and district environmental authorities shall consist of the following parts:
  - a) Name and site of the authority issuing the program and principal data on the ecology and economic characteristics of the program territory,
  - b. Recent status of waste management, specifying the amount of waste produced in the preceding period, and a review of equipment used for waste disposal,
    - a. Waste management budget in the preceding period, specifying the waste management costs and sources of coverage,
    - b. Objectives of the waste management and measure to realize them, including implementation deadlines of such measures and costs thereof.
2. Programs of county and district environmental authorities shall be formulated in the form of schedules as shown in Annex 1 of this Regulation and shall contain at least the scope of data presented by this Annex.

### ***Article 4***

1. Programs and their updates are issued in a publicly accessible manner.

2. County and district environmental authorities shall make their programs public by methods usually employed in their respective localities, and by posting them at the official notice boards for at least 15 days.
3. Natural persons and legal entities who could document their qualified interest may examine the program at its authority of issuance.

#### *Article 5*

1. Programs shall be prepared by producers who produce more than 100 kg of hazardous waste annually or more than 1 ton of special waste or 10 tons of other waste<sup>4)</sup>.
2. Producers may agree on preparation of a joint program.

#### *Article 6*

1. Producer programs shall consist of the following parts:
  - a. Fundamental data of the producer enabling his identification, and on the type and range of production. If the producer is a municipality, data on the type and range of production type are not necessary,
  - b. Recent status of waste management of the producer, specifying the amount of waste produced in the preceding period, and data on equipment used for waste disposal, its operator and location,
  - c. Waste management budget of the producer in the preceding period, specifying his costs and sources of coverage related to waste management,
  - d. Objectives of waste management of the producer, and measures to realize them, including implementation deadlines of such measures, and costs thereof,
  - e. Confirmation of the program data by signature of the authorized representative of the producer,
  - f. Annex, showing the pertinent decisions of administrative bodies issued to the producer in matters of waste management, protocols of inspections in the field of waste management, and in case of producers other than municipalities, viewpoints of affected municipalities to the proposed program.
2. Programs of producers shall be formulated in the form of schedules as shown in Annex 2 of this Regulation, and shall contain at least the scope of data presented by this Annex.

#### *Article 7*

The producer shall submit his program for approval to the environmental authority of jurisdiction<sup>5)</sup> at the first occasion within 3 months from the end of the 15-day period of its posting at the official notice board pursuant to Article 4, Section 2 of this Regulation.

#### *Article 8*

This Regulation shall become enforceable on the day of its promulgation.
