

CHAPTER 240.

TOWNS AND VILLAGES (WATER SUPPLY).

NO. 1. — SOUFRIERE WATER SUPPLY.

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE WATER AUTHORITY FOR THE TOWN AND DISTRICT
OF SOUFRIERE UNDER THE AUTHORITY OF THE TOWNS AND VILLAGES
(WATER SUPPLY) ORDINANCE. 1916 Rev.
Ch. 39.

1. The Water Authority shall hold its meetings on such days as may be fixed by the Chairman.
2. Special meetings may be summoned by order of the Governor or on the application of any two members of the Water Authority.
3. Any three members with the Chairman shall be a quorum.
4. The Water Authority shall in or before the month of February in each year fix, for the current year, a general water rate payable upon the annual rental value of all tenements within the Town and District, and an annual sum, or private water supply rate, on all tenements therein supplied with a private water service.
5. When such rates have been fixed the Chairman of the Water Authority shall notify in the *Gazette* the rates so fixed.
6. The assessment of the annual rental value of all tenements within the Town for the payment of all water rates shall be such assessment as is ascertained by the assesment list prepared by the Clerk to the Local Authority under the Local Authorities Ordinance, then in force after all objections to such list have been heard and determined as provided by such Ordinance, and where no assesment has been made then the assesment list for the preceding year shall be taken as the assesment for the current year.
7. The water rates on all tenements in the District shall be collected on the annual rental value of such tenements as assessed by an officer appointed by the Water Authority in or before the month of February in each year. A list of such assesments shall be published in the *Gazette*, and any person who is not satisfied with the assesment of any tenement may appeal in writing, within 14 days of such publication, to the Water Authority who shall have power to confirm, alter or amend such assesment, and any alterations or amendments so made shall be published in the *Gazette*.

8. The Water Authority may from time to time fix a sum to be paid for every hundred gallons, or fractional part, of water supplied to shipping, and in case a sum shall not be so fixed, then there shall be collected the sum of 36¢ for every 100 gallons or fractional part thereof for water so supplied.

9. The master, owner or agent of any steamer, vessel or boat requiring water shall apply to the Sub-Collector, and, on payment to him of the dues, the water shall be supplied under the supervision of an officer of the Water Authority.

10. The Water Authority may, for water regularly supplied coasting steamers, fix a special rate and sanction payment of such rate to be made monthly or otherwise.

11. No person shall fill any cask or other receptacle with water from any standpipe or private service pipe for the purpose of supplying any steamer, vessel or boat with water. All water so required must be applied for and supplied as provided under regulation 9.

12. Every person requiring a private water service shall apply in writing to the Chairman of the Water Authority.

13. On the receipt of such application, the Chairman shall cause an estimate of the cost of laying on the service to be made and shall furnish the applicant with a statement thereof and on the payment to the Treasurer or Sub-Collector of the amount so estimated the service shall be laid on.

14. Should the cost of laying on the service exceed the estimate, the applicant shall pay the difference before the water service is turned on, and should the amount paid on the estimate be in excess of the actual cost the excess shall be refunded to the applicant.

15. Every application for alteration or repairs to any private water service shall be made and dealt with in the same manner as an application for a private service in the first instance.

16. Every person, on whose tenement a private water service is laid, shall immediately report to the Chairman of the Water Authority, or one of the officers, any leak or break that may occur to the pipes, taps and other appliances.

17. The Water Authority shall have the right to determine finally all matters concerning the construction or alteration of private water services, and the materials and fittings to be used and applied.

18. No person shall reconstruct, alter, extend, remove or in any manner whatever interfere with the pipes, taps and other appliances connected with the private water service on his tenement, without the sanction of the Water Authority.

19. The owner of any tenement in the Town supplied with a private water supply, who desires such supply to be discontinued, shall give notice in writing to the Chairman of the Water Authority on or before the 31st December in any year, provided that such service may be discontinued at the request in writing of the owner at any time, without prejudice to the payment of any water rate or other sums due or to become due in respect of such water service for the current year.

20. Where the water from any private service is allowed to run to waste or to be used in such a manner, or for any purpose by which dirty or offensive water is allowed to rest on the tenement, or to flow into the tenement of any other person, or to flow into any street, drain or other public place, or where the water is used for any purposes contrary to the Towns and Villages (Water Supply) Ordinance or any regulations made thereunder, the Water Authority may with or without notice shut off the supply either temporarily or permanently without prejudice to the payment of any water rate or other sums due or to become due in respect of any such water for the current year.

21. No person on whose tenement a private water service is provided, shall by means of any pipe, tube, hose, drain or other conduit allow water to be supplied to any other tenement, upon which there is no private water service.

22. No person shall put his mouth to any tap attached to any hydrant, or street fountain, or standpipe, in any public place for the purpose of drinking water, or stop or attempt to stop the flow of water by placing the hand or anything at the end of any such tap.

23. No person shall open, handle or otherwise interfere with any tap attached to any hydrant, or street fountain, or standpipe, in any public place except for the purpose of drawing water therefrom, or for closing a tap left open, and no person shall after drawing water leave any tap open or partially open so as to cause water to run to waste.

24. No person shall bathe or wash his hands, face or feet, or bathe any child or any animal, or wash any cloth or clothes at any street hydrant, or street fountain, or standpipe, in any public place.

25. No person shall without authority handle, move, or otherwise interfere with any of the fire appliances of the Waterworks, when in use for the purpose of extinguishing fires.

26. No person shall stand, sit, or rest anything, on any pipe which passes above ground on any pipe track, nor rest anything on any hydrant, street fountain, standpipe or reservoir; but this shall not be taken to limit ordinary traffic over pipes and hydrants laid in a public way.

27. No person shall trespass on any enclosed land appropriated or used for Waterworks purpose.

28. No person shall make fast any animal to any fence, pipe, or hydrant, or allow any animal to wander on or to traverse any pipe track except on the paths especially provided.

29. The water overflowing from any reservoir may be utilised or disposed of by the Water Authority in such manner or on such conditions as the Water Authority may determine.

30. The Clerk to the Local Authority is empowered to make use of water from any hydrant in the Town for sanitary and other purposes, subject to the control of the Chairman of the Water Authority.

NO. 2. — VIEUX-FORT WATER SUPPLY.

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE WATER AUTHORITY FOR THE TOWN AND DISTRICT OF VIEUX-FORT UNDER THE AUTHORITY OF THE TOWNS AND VILLAGES (WATER SUPPLY) ORDINANCE.

1. The Water Authority shall hold its meetings not less than once in each quarter on such days as may be fixed by the Chairman.

2. Special meetings may be summoned by order of the Governor or on the application of any two members of the Water Authority.

3. Any three members with the Chairman shall be a quorum.

4. The Water Authority shall in or before the month of February in each year fix, for the current year, a general water rate payable upon the annual rental value of all tenements within the Town and District, and an annual sum, or private water supply rate, on all tenements therein supplied with a private water service.

5. When such rates have been fixed the Chairman of the Water Authority shall notify in the *Gazette* the rates so fixed.

6. The assessment of the annual rental value of all tenements within the Town for the payment of all water rates shall be such assessment as is ascertained by the assessment list prepared by the Clerk to the Local Authority under the Local Authorities Ordinance, then in force after all objections to such list have been heard and determined as provided by such Ordinance, and where no assessment has been made then the assessment list for the preceding year shall be taken as the assessment for the current year.

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7. The water rates on all tenements in the District shall be collected on the annual rental value of such tenements as assessed by an officer appointed by the Water Authority in or before the month of February in each year. A list of such assessments shall be published in the *Gazette*, and any person who is not satisfied with the assessment of any tenement may appeal in writing, within 14 days of such publication, to the Water Authority who shall have power to confirm, alter or amend such assessment, and any alterations or amendments so made shall be published in the *Gazette*.

Where the water from any private service is allowed to run to waste or to be used in such a manner or for any purpose by which dirty or offensive water is allowed to rest on the tenement or to flow into the tenement of any other person, or to flow into any street drain or other public place or where the water is used for any purposes contrary to the Towns and Villages (Water Supply) Ordinance or any regulations made thereunder, the Water Authority may with or without notice shut off the supply either temporarily or permanently without prejudice to the payment of any water rate or other sums due or to become due in respect of any such water for the current year.

21. No person on whose tenement a private water service is provided, shall by means of any pipe, tube, hose, drain, or other conduit, allow water to be supplied to any other tenement, upon which there is no private water service.

22. No person shall put his mouth to any tap attached to any hydrant, or street fountain, or standpipe in any public place for the purpose of drinking water, or stop or attempt to stop the flow of water by placing the hand or anything at the end of any such tap.

23. No person shall open, handle or otherwise interfere with any tap attached to any hydrant, or street fountain, or standpipe, in any public place except for the purpose of drawing water therefrom, or for closing a tap left open, and no person shall after drawing water leave any tap open or partially open so as to cause water to run to waste.

24. No person shall bathe or wash his hands, face or feet, or bathe any child or any animal, or wash any cloth or clothes at any street hydrant, or street fountain or standpipe, in any public place.

NO. 3. — CHOISEUL WATER SUPPLY.

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE WATER AUTHORITY FOR THE VILLAGE AND DISTRICT OF CHOISEUL UNDER THE AUTHORITY OF THE TOWNS AND VILLAGES (WATER SUPPLY) ORDINANCE.

1. The Water Authority shall hold its meetings not less than once in each quarter on such days as may be fixed by the Chairman.

2. Special meetings may be summoned by order of the Governor or on the application of any two members of the Water Authority.

3. Any three members with the Chairman shall be a quorum.

4. The Water Authority shall in or before the month of February in each year fix, for the current year, a general water rate payable upon the annual rental value of all tenements within the Village and District, and an annual sum, or private water supply rate, on all tenements therein supplied with a private water service.

5. When such rates have been fixed the Chairman of the Water Authority shall notify in the *Gazette* the rates so fixed.

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6. The assessment of the annual rental value of all tenements within the Village for the payment of all water rates shall be such assessment as is ascertained by the assessment list prepared by the Clerk to the Local Authority under the Local Authorities Ordinance, then in force after all objections to such list have been heard and determined as provided by such Ordinance, and where no assessment has been made then the assessment list for the preceding year shall be taken as the assessment for the current year.

11. No person shall fill any cask or other receptacle with water from any standpipe or private service pipe for the purpose of supplying any steamer, vessel or boat with water. All water so required must be applied for and supplied as provided under regulation 9.

12. Every person requiring a private water service shall apply in writing to the Chairman of the Water Authority.

13. 25. No person shall without authority handle, move or otherwise interfere with any of the fire appliances of the Waterworks, when in use for the purpose of extinguishing fires.

26. No person shall stand, sit, or rest anything, on any pipe, which passes above ground on any pipe track nor rest anything on any hydrant, street fountain, standpipe or reservoir; but this shall not be taken to limit ordinary traffic over pipes and hydrants laid in a public way.

27. No person shall trespass on any enclosed land appropriated or used for Waterworks purposes.

28. No person shall make fast any animal to any fence, pipe, or hydrant, or allow any animal to wander on or traverse any pipe track except on the tracks especially provided.

29. The water overflowing from any reservoir may be utilised or disposed of by the Water Authority in such manner or on such conditions as the Water Authority may determine.

30. The Clerk to the Local Authority is empowered to make use of water from any hydrant in the Village for sanitary and other purposes, subject to the control of the Chairman of the Water Authority.

3. Any three members with the Chairman shall be a quorum.
