

**THE GAME (PRESERVATION AND CONTROL) ACT.**

Statutory Instrument 226--15.

**The Game (Semliki Flats Hunting Area) Order.**

L.N. 353  
of 1963.

*(Sections 71 and 72 of the Act).*

1. (1) THIS ORDER may be cited as the Game (Semliki Flats Hunting Area) Order.

(2) This Order shall apply to the area specified in the First Schedule to this Order.

2. The hunting of any species of scheduled animals specified in the Second Schedule to this Order is hereby prohibited.

3. In respect of any species of scheduled animals specified in the first column of the Third Schedule to this Order the number of each of such species which may be hunted in any one calendar year shall be the number respectively set out in the second column of such Schedule.

4. It is hereby prescribed that on the issue of a permit to hunt any species of the scheduled animals specified in the Third Schedule to this Order there shall be paid to the Government of the Kingdom of Toro the basic fee as specified in that Schedule and, in addition, the fee respectively specified in respect of each of such species in the third, fourth and fifth columns of that Schedule.

5. It is hereby declared that a request has been received in writing from the Government of the Kingdom of Toro to prescribe the fees specified in the fifth column of the Third Schedule to this Order in respect of permits issued to *bona fide* residents of the Kingdom.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

The area comprised within the following boundaries—

Commencing at the cairn situated one-half of a mile due south of Makoga Hill; thence along the northern boundary of the Toro Game Reserve to the shore of Lake Albert; thence in a northerly direction along

the shore-line of the lake to the mouth of the Semliki River; thence following the west bank of the Semliki River (the Uganda/Congo boundary) upstream to its confluence with the Ngeti River; thence in an easterly direction in a straight line to the village of Rwebishengo; thence in a south-easterly direction in a straight line to Makoga Hill; thence due south to the point of commencement (cairn).
